

Ladies' spring program prepared

Tentative plans for the ladies' program during the 1977 Spring Meeting in New York have been completed by the program committee, headed by Clare Kalustian of Boonton, NJ.

Final plans were to be confirmed in mid-October, too late to be included in the November *JAOCs*.

"We hope to have a tour of the United Nations, including a lecture and lunch in the delegates' dining hall," Mrs. Kalustian said. "They have the international shopping area and bazaar. We'd like to have a tour of that area of New York also."

An opening tea is planned for Sunday in a ladies' hospitality suite at the Americana Hotel, she said.

Specific days for various programs were to be set after the October meeting, she said. Other activities probably will include a tour of Greenwich Village and Soho, including visits to brownstone townhouses and artists' lofts in those areas.

Since the New York meeting will be a four-day session (May 8-12), the general banquet will be held Wednesday night.

"We'll probably have an awards luncheon Thursday afternoon," Mrs. Kalustian said. "There'll be another day with entertainment and door prizes."

Tentative plans are to provide open time each afternoon.

"We're excited about the program and hope there will be a good turnout," Mrs. Kalustian said.

Details on other parts of the meeting program were to be discussed at the mid-October planning session. The general call for papers deadline is Dec. 1.
