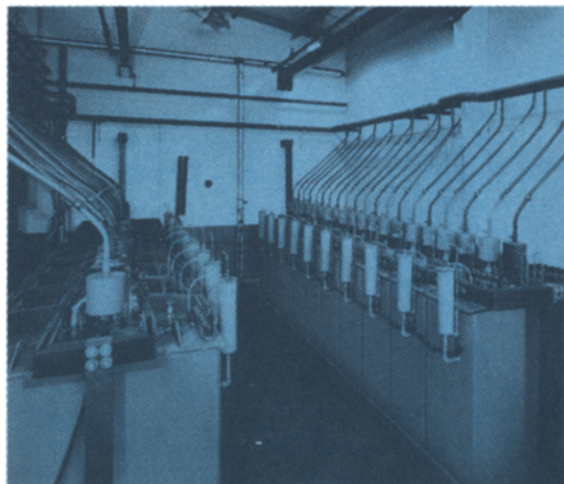
ISA symposium July 24-29
