
### P&G shifts three

THE FATTY ACIDS OF THE PURPLE BACTERIA RHODOPSEUDOMONAS PALUSTRIS AND RHODOPSEUDOMONAS SPHERIODS UNDER PHOTOTROPIC AND AEROBIC HETEROTROPHIC CONDITIONS OF GROWTH. F. Gemeinhardt and K. Knobloch. Seifen, Ole, Fette, Wachse. 104(16), 457-61 (1978). Under different conditions of growth (photosynthetic or heterotrophic in the dark), the Rhodospirillacae, Rhodopseudomonas palustris and R. spheroides fatty acid patterns which differ in terms of quality and quantity. A cyclic C 17 carboxyl acid has been found.

NEW EXAMINATIONS OF WATER THINNABLE AIR DRYING ALKYD RESINS. R. Dhein, H.U. Pohl and J. Schoeps. Farbe Lack 84(9), 680-4 (1978). Selected new binder types and drying

processes in water thinnable coatings are examined. Comments are made about the amine emission into the surrounding air, amine reduction, oxygen uptake of the binders and their yellowing after air drying. Following these examinations possible applications for water thinnable air drying binders are pointed out.

FLUORINATED WETTING AGENTS—A PRODUCT GROUP OF SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL INTEREST. H. Niederprum. Seifen, Ole, Fette, Wachse. 104(15) 429-32 (1978). Dealt with are properties, synthesis, application and new developments. An extensive bibliography indicates important work on this subject.
