One-day analytical short course November 19

A one-day Short Course, "New Aspects of Lipid Analysis," will be presented Monday, Nov. 19, 1979, at the O'Hare Ramada Inn, Chicago, under sponsorship of the American Oil Chemists' Society, Chicago Chromatography Discussion Group and the North Central Section of the American Oil Chemists' Society.

Dr. E.G. Perkins of the University of Illinois, session chairman, has arranged a program of approximately ten speakers. Dr. Eleanor Berman of the Department of Biochemistry at Cook County Hospital, will serve as co-chairman.

Cost will be \$25 for AOCS or Chicago Chromatography Discussion Group members, \$35 for nonmembers; and \$15 for students. The registration fee does not include lunch.

- Analysis of Detergents by Chromatographic Techniques, Irving Domsky, Allied Laboratory.

- Gas Chromatographic Studies of the Lipids of Human Cerumen, Leon Gershbein, Northwest Institute of Medical Research.

Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. with the program starting at 9 a.m. Participants will have a lunch break from noon to 1:30 p.m. The meeting will adjourn about 4:30 p.m. All registrants will receive a copy of "Analysis of Lipids and Lipoproteins," an AOCS monograph edited by Dr. Perkins.

A limited number of rooms have been reserved for Sunday night, Nov. 18, 1979, for persons who wish to stay overnight before the short course. Registrants should make reservations directly with the hotel, notifying the hotel they will be attending the short course.
