If your slides are overcrowded with information, your audience will stop listening to what you're saying in a vain attempt to try to understand your slide.

For example, use only six or fewer horizontal lines of typed material on a slide. Make sure your slides are legible to the fellow in the back row of a room with 100 to 300 persons. Practice with a coworker to make sure your talk and your slides complement each other.

Registrants at past meetings complain more often about quality of slides than about any other facet of AOCS meetings. You can make the meeting more beneficial to your colleagues and make sure your work is better understood with a little extra attention to visual aids.
