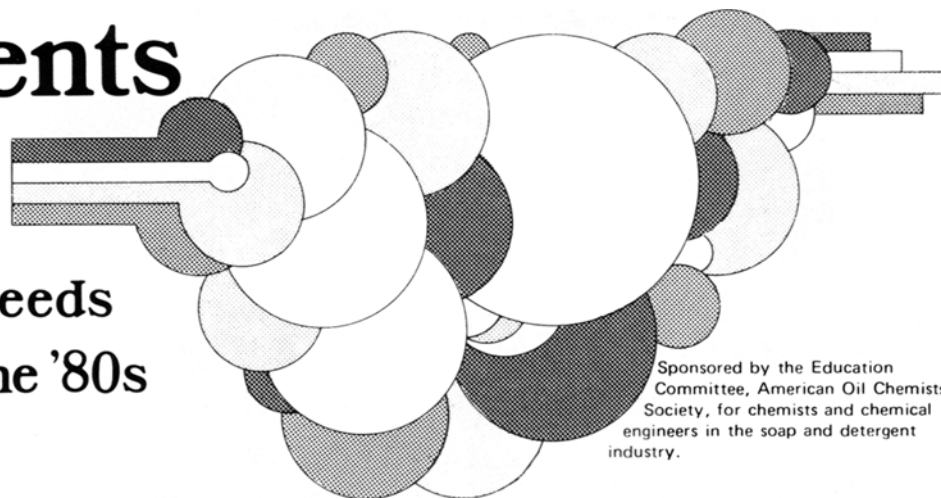

## Soya program nears completion

Session chairmen for the World Conference on Soya Processing and Utilization have completed their work on the plenary program and are now concentrating on selecting speakers for the informal afternoon round table discussions to be held each day during the conference to be held Nov. 9-14, 1980, in the Acapulco (Mexico) Convention Center.

The conference is designed to provide state-of-the-art knowledge and technology about processing and use of soya in countries that could improve the quantity and nutritional quality of food in their national diets through increased use of soya products. The conference also aims at establishing constructive and continuing exchanges of information between experts in processing and use and those persons who can put such information to practical applications.

The plenary program was published in the May JAOCS. Brochures with that program, as well as registration forms and housing and travel information, are available from AOCS, 508 S. Sixth St., Champaign, IL 61820.

There will be three to four simultaneous round table discussions each afternoon. These sessions will provide registrants with a chance to comment on the plenary talks they have heard as well as to question the plenary speakers. In addition, most session chairmen plan to have supplementary speakers who will either go into more detail on plenary topics or explore subjects for which there was not time during the plenary program. □
