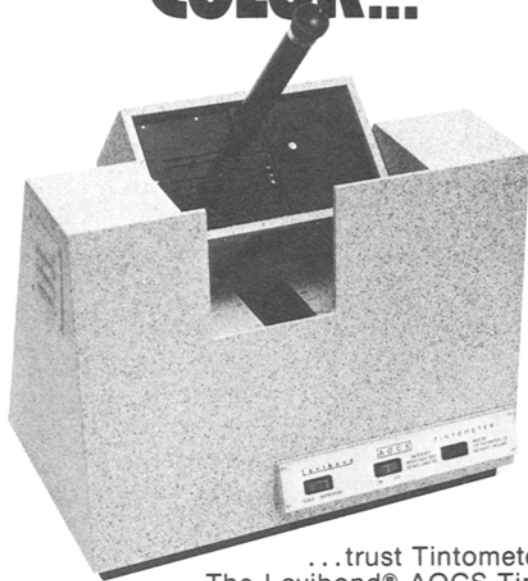


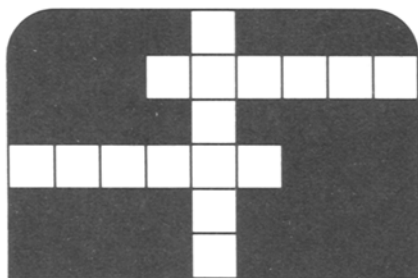

Inside AOCs

Postage costs rising

U.S. postal rates have risen to the point where the AOCs Governing Board has determined it will be necessary to charge all non-U.S. members a postage surcharge of \$10 per year to cover costs of mailing *JAOCs*. The fee is the same as currently paid by non-members outside the U.S. who pay \$50 for their annual subscription to *JAOCs* plus \$10 for postage. Postage fees for mailing *JAOCs* to Canada, for example, recently were doubled. The postage surcharge will begin with 1983 membership dues; a notice concerning the surcharge will be included in membership dues notices mailed starting in 1982.
