
After Deadline



DANIEL SWERN

Dr. Daniel A. Swern, professor of chemistry at Temple University in Philadelphia, PA, died during December, 1982. Dr. Swern is perhaps best known to fats and oils researchers as the senior editor for recent editions of <u>Bailey's Industrial Oil and Fat</u> Products. He was 66 years old.

Dr. Swern was a graduate of the city College of New York, Columbia University, and the University of Maryland. Dr. Swern served as a chemist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture from

1937 to 1963 at the Eastern Regional Research Center in Philadelphia. In 1963 he joined the faculty at Temple.

Dr. Swern was the 1965 recipient of the Bailey Award from the North Central Section of the AOCS and the 1968 recipient of the AOCS Award in Lipid Chemistry. He also had received the Bond Award for best presentation of a technical paper at a national AOCS meeting. He received numerous federal government outstanding employee and achievement awards.

In 1980, when he was one of the first three recipients of Temple University Faculty Awards for Research and Creative Achievements, Dr. Swern was cited for his work "in the fields of lipid chemistry, fatty acid oxidation peroxide chemistry and related areas." He had served as a visiting lecturer or researcher at universities in Japan, Israel and England.

Dr. Swern joined the AOCS in 1942 while a research chemist at the USDA Eastern Regional Research Center.

UZZAN TO HEAD ITERG

Aldo Uzzan has been named director general for the Institut des Corps Gras (ITERG) in France, succeeding J.P. Wolff who had served in that capacity for many years. Dr. Wolff was a speaker at the World Conference on Oilseed and Edible Oil Processing held this past October in The Hague. Dr. Uzzan has participated in several AOCS annual meetings and international conferences and is serving on a committee organizing an international meeting for 1985.
