Federation proposed

A preliminary discussion on formation of an international federation of fats and oils societies will be held May 5, 1985, in Philadelphia. The AOCS Executive Committee during its meeting in February approved AOCS acting as host for such a meeting.

A. R. Baldwin was asked to send letters of invitation to representatives of various professional fats and oils organizations. Purpose of such a federation would be to coordinate professional activities and to improve international communications, although a specific statement of purpose and goals would depend on reaction to the proposal by potential members. No specific activities or budgets have been proposed. About 30 persons are expected to be asked to attend the preliminary discussion.

In other business at the meeting, it was reported that the University of Illinois has expressed strong interest in obtaining the AOCS Headquarters building which is near the University of Illinois campus. The university has proposed an arrangement whereby there would be, in effect, a property swap between AOCS and the university, although

the actual exchange would be with a third party. The headquarters would remain in the Champaign-Urbana community.

AOCS Vice President Joyce Beare-Rogers reported 686 new members had been approved during the 1984 membership year, with 498 active members; 80 individual associate; 89 student members; 17 corporate, and two retired. Five members have been granted emeritus status: Elwood F. Daly, Cecilia Gilmore, Clarence Y. Hopkins, Travis L. Budlong and William M. Wagner.

The executive committee approved the purchase of a new typesetting system for AOCS. The present system was purchased in 1978 and is no longer being manufactured; service is available, but spare parts are becoming scarce. The new system will incorporate electronic typesetting and will be a faster system, meaning far less typesetting will be contracted with commercial printers.

In other action, the executive committee approved AOCS endorsement of a detergent short course being arranged for June by AOCS member Paul Sosis under sponsorship of the Chemical Specialty Manufacturers Association.
