Obituaries

CHARLES V. BACON JR.

Charles V. Bacon Jr., 73, retired, of Irvington, New Jersey, died May 24, 1989. Charles V. Bacon Inc. was founded by his father.

Mr. Bacon joined AOCS in 1965. He studied chemical engineering at Purdue University and chemistry at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute and Seton Hall University. He also completed a two-year refining process course at Standard Oil Developing Co. He served in

the military during 1940 to 1945 and 1952 to 1953. He worked as a chemist and surveyor at Charles V. Bacon Inc. in New York from 1947 to 1952, then returned in 1956. He became vice president and managing director in 1960. The business was sold to a holding company in the early 1970s. Mr. Bacon then continued as a consultant to the firm

Mr. Bacon left a \$2,500 bequest to AOCS.

GEORGE M. BRIGGS

George M. Briggs, 70, a member of AOCS since 1979, died May 31, 1989. He was a professor emeritus at the University of California at Berkelev at the time of his death.

He received his doctorate in biochemistry at the University of Wisconsin in 1944. Dr. Briggs began his career as a poultry nutrition professor at the University of Maryland and the University of Minnesota. He went on to work at the chief nutrition unit at the National Institute of Health in Bethesda, Maryland, between 1951 and 1960. He subsequently served as chairman of the Department of Nutritional Sciences and associate dean of the College of Natural Resources at the University of California before retiring in 1983.

AOCS has been informed of the death of Edwin Marshall Meade. 78, of Duncan. British Columbia. Canada. Dr. Meade had been a member of AOCS since 1952.

He had been an industry consultant for many years and most recently had operated Meade Research Co. Ltd. His career, which
