MEETING OF COUNCIL.

A meeting of Council was held on Thursday, January 9th, 1947.

The Report of the Publication Committee (January 9th) was adopted and the recom-

mendation for a new cover for the Journal for 1947 was approved.

The action of the Royal Institute of Chemistry in printing and making available free of charge to Fellows of the Chemical Society copies of Dr. Dyson's lecture "A New Notation for Organic Chemistry "was warmly approved, and Council agreed that a letter of appreciation and thanks should be sent to the Institute.

It was reported that the Official Meeting in Edinburgh on December 19th had been very successful, and it was agreed to convey the thanks of the Society to Sir John Fraser, Vice-Chancellor and Principal of the University, to the Local Representative, and to the local organisers for the arrangements made and the hospitality which the Society received on this occasion.

Consideration was given to the question of extending beyond the present age limit the payment of the reduced annual subscription by Fellows who had been in H.M. Forces, and the resolution, quoted above, was passed.

It was noted with pleasure that Professor T. S. Patterson had made a donation to the Society's funds and that Mr. H. H. Hughes had made a gift of the Society's publications.

The list of vacancies on Council for 1947—1948 was notified.

Nominations for Honorary Fellows were considered.

Eighty-seven Candidates for Fellowship were elected Fellows of the Society.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON

ABERDEEN.

"Mechanism of Elimination and Substitution Reactions," by Dr. F. W. Peaker.

A joint meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry was held in the Chemistry Department, Marischal College, on December 17th, 1946.

Dr. Peaker outlined the recent work done to elucidate the mechanism of elimination and substitution reactions which do not involve free radicals. This indicates that substitution reactions fall into two categories. Depending on the groups present and on the reaction conditions they proceed (a) as bimolecular reactions, or (b) as unimolecular reactions.

The modern interpretations of the Walden Inversion and the Hofmann Degradation were also described.

A CENTURY OF CHEMISTRY

SPECIAL COMMEMORATIVE MEETING WITH THE ROYAL SOCIETY OF ARTS.

A special meeting arranged jointly by the Society and the Royal Society of Arts was held on Wednesday, February 19th, at 5 p.m. at the House of the Royal Society of Arts in John Adam Street, London, W.C.2.

The meeting was specially arranged as part of the Centenary Celebrations to commemorate the foundation of the Society, which took place at a meeting held at the House of the Royal Society of Arts on February 23rd, 1841. SIR THOMAS HOLLAND, K.C.S.I., K.C.I.E., D.L., D.Sc., F.R.S., senior past Chairman of Council of the Royal Society of Arts, presided. He referred to the first meeting of the Chemical Society and to the early and subsequent links between the two societies. He then invited Sir Harold Hartley, K.C.V.O., C.B.E., M.C., M.A., F.R.S., to deliver his lecture entitled "A Century of Chemistry".

SIR HAROLD HARTLEY, after briefly outlining the state of chemistry in 1841 and referring to the contributions made before 1841 by Lavoisier, Priestley, Dalton, and Berzelius, went on to describe the development of chemistry by Liebig, Kolbe, Hofmann, Kekulé, Laurent, Gerhardt, Mendeleef, and others. The contributions to physical chemistry by Ostwald, van't Hoff, Arrhenius, Thomson, Becquerel, Madame Curie, Rayleigh, and Ramsay, and others were also described. The main lines of the development of chemistry since the beginning of the present century to the present day were then reviewed. In a concluding section, SIR HAROLD referred to the highly important and significant part played by the application of chemistry to industry, and he indicated what he considered might be the problems which chemists should seek to solve in the future.

DR. R. P. LINSTEAD, Vice-President of the Chemical Society, in proposing the vote of thanks to the lecturer, read a telegram from the President, Professor C. N. Hinshelwood, sending his good wishes for the success of the meeting and regretting that owing to illness he was unable to be present. Dr. Linstead drew attention to the Society's Obligation Book, the first Minute Book and the Jubilee Album, which were on exhibition at the meeting. He also thanked the Royal Society of Arts for their co-operation in arranging the meeting. In referring to Sir Harold Hartley's lecture, he described it as a masterly historic address for a great occasion. The vote of thanks was carried with great enthusiasm.

A meeting of Council was held on Thursday, February 6th, 1947.

The Annual Report for 1946 of the Publication Committee and the report of the Committee's meeting (January 9th) were adopted.

The Annual Report for 1946 of the Joint Library Committee and the report of the Committee's meeting (January 29th) were approved.

A gift from Mr. Charles Gilling of the Society's publications was noted with pleasure.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON

ABERDEEN.

"Recent Advances in the Metabolism of Proteins and Amino-acids", by Dr. D. P. Cuthbertson.

A meeting was held at Marischal College, Aberdeen, on January 24th, 1947. Dr. Cuthbertson dealt with the digestion of proteins and the mode of absorption of the resulting amino-acids by the animal body. The effects of varying the protein content of diet were discussed. The amino-acid composition of many sources of protein were compared, and the amino-acids classified as essential or non-essential constituents of diet. Much recent work on the fate of amino-acids in the animal body was made possible by the use of "marked" isotopic carbon.

LIVERPOOL.

"Metabolic Cycles", by Professor H. A. Krebs, M.A., M.D.

A Joint Meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry, the Society of Chemical Industry, the British Association of Chemists and the University Chemical Society, was held on January 23rd, 1947, at Liverpool University, Professor R. A. Morton being in the Chair.

Professor Krebs expounded his subject in a very interesting and provocative manner, by a judicious blending of the proved scientific fact and philosophical speculation, with particular reference to the "ornithine cycle"—one of his own most notable contributions to this field.

A vote of thanks, carried with acclamation, was proposed by Dr. R. J. S. Beer, and seconded by Dr. R. T. Williams.

NOTTINGHAM.

"Some Aspects of the Chemistry of Paludrine", by Dr. F. L. Rose.

A joint meeting with the University College Chemical Society was held at University College, Nottingham, on November 21st, 1946. Professor J. M. Gulland, F.R.S., was in the Chair.

Dr. Rose pointed out that it was not yet possible to predict with accuracy the biological properties of a drug possessing a new type of structure, and research in the field of chemotherapy must depend on working hypotheses based on the biological effects produced by known compounds. Dr. Rose described how the application of this method led to the preparation of the antimalarial drug Paludrine, and put forward a tentative suggestion as to the mode of action of this drug.

Dr. J. C. Roberts thanked Dr. Rose for his interesting lecture.

"Recent Advances in the Chemistry of the Enzyme", by Dr. J. A. V. Butler.

A joint meeting with the University College Chemical Society was held at University College, Nottingham, on January 23rd, 1947, Dr. D. O. Jordan was in the Chair.

Dr. Butler described how in recent years many enzymes have been prepared in the crystalline state, and discussed the relationship between enzymes and proteins. Recent work employing crystalline enzymes and pure protein preparations appears to be a promising, though laborious, method of attacking the problem of protein structure. Dr. Butler was thanked for his stimulating lecture by Mr. K. Selby, the President of the College Chemical Society.

SOUTH WALES.

"The Absorption of Light", by Mr. E. J. Bowen, M.A., F.R.S.

A meeting was held jointly with the University College of Swansea Chemical Society on January 31st, 1947, in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre, University College, Swansea. The Chair was taken by Professor J. E. Coates, the Local Representative. Mr. Bowen

discussed energy quantisation on the basis of wave-mechanics, and showed how the wave-mechanical orbitals of atoms and molecules could be graphically represented, the quantum number being identified as nodes in the orbital diagrams. He discussed the types of bonding from the wave-mechanical aspect and the essential characteristics of light absorption by atoms and molecules, and illustrated the theory by reference to conjugated double bond molecules from butadiene to carotene, to the ring systems from benzene to pentacene, to p-nitrophenol and other indicators, and to dyes and other organic compounds such as aldehydes and ketones. He brought out in a striking way that many aspects of light absorption of chemical interest could readily be presented without much mathematics by means of graphical representations such as orbital diagrams and potential energy curves.

After a brief discussion in which Dr. N. H. Hartshorne inquired about pleochroism, a vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Mr. R. H. Davies, seconded by Mr. J. J. Austin, and carried with enthusiasm.

"Structural Inorganic Chemistry", by Professor W. Wardlaw, D.Sc., F.R.I.C.

A meeting was held jointly with the Cardiff and District Section of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and the South Wales Section of the Society of Chemical Industry on February 9th, 1947, at University College, Cardiff. The Chair was taken by Mr. P. V. Lloyd. Professor Wardlaw stressed the profound effect of new methods, such as X-ray analysis, on the concepts of inorganic chemistry. Reviewing the simple lattices of sodium chloride and cæsium chloride and the less simple lattice of ferrous sulphide, he discussed the problem of the iron defect or sulphur excess, relative to the formula FeS, shown by magnetic iron sulphide (pyrrhotite) and explained how, by correlating density and composition, it had been established that some Fe positions in the lattice were vacant, a result of some interest in relation to the "Law of Constant Composition".

Among other topics the lecturer indicated that the apparently analogous CaCO₃, CaSiO₃, CaTiO₃, are now known to have distinctly different structures, and showed how magnetic properties had helped in elucidating the structure of iron carbonyl and related compounds; he further dealt with phosphorus pentachloride, and called attention to recent studies of the Si-O, P-O, S-O, Cl-O linkages in silicates, phosphates, etc., which had yielded unexpected results, so that much uncertainty now exists as to the structural formulæ of these compounds.

A vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Mr. S. J. H. O. Chard, seconded by Mr. H. F. Adams and carried with enthusiasm.

The process was followed through the stages of crushing, separation by means of screens and/or air blast, and finally grinding. Air separation and roll grinding may be combined with advantage. The different types of crushers, separators, and grinding mills were illustrated by many slides.

"The Composition and Structure of Proteins," by Professor A. C. Chibnall, M.A., Sc.D., F.R.S.

A meeting was held at Marischal College, Aberdeen, on March 11th, 1947. Professor Chibnall indicated that newer methods for estimating the amino-acid composition of proteins give sufficiently accurate and concordant values to permit of calculation of the ratios in which the various amino acids occur in the protein molecule.

Examination of insulin by this method, by X-ray crystallography and with the ultra centrifuge all indicate that insulin is built of units of M.W. ca. 12,000. By tagging of the end amino groups it has been shown that these units contain four polypeptide chains. Work is proceeding to break the -S-S- cross linkings of the chains by oxidative or reductive methods.

BIRMINGHAM.

"Surface Chemistry and Colloids," by Dr. A. E. Alexander, B.Sc.

A joint meeting with the University Chemical Society was held in the Chemical Lecture Theatre of the University, Edgbaston, Birmingham, on February 21st, 1947. The Chairman, Dr. L. L. Bircumshaw, welcomed the Lecturer and gave a brief account of the early development of surface chemistry. Dr. Alexander outlined the principal experimental techniques now in use, paying particular attention to adsorbed insoluble films at air/water

and oil/water interfaces. Examples were given illustrating their relevance to certain aspects of colloids such as proteins, protein monolayers, foams and emulsions stabilised by soaps and proteins, the mechanical properties of proteins and finally a few biological applications. A vote of thanks to the Lecturer, carried with acclamation, was proposed by Dr. S. R. Carter and seconded by Dr. R. W. Kent.

EDINBURGH.

"Fluorescence," by Dr. N. Campbell.

A joint meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and Society of Chemical Industry was held in the North British Station Hotel, Edinburgh, on February 20th, 1947, with Dr. Percival in the Chair. By means of experiments, demonstrations, and slides Dr. Campbell gave a stimulating account of fluorescence and its applications. A lively discussion followed, and a hearty vote of thanks proposed by Mr. R. G. Thin was carried with enthusiasm.

"The Composition and Structure of Proteins," by Professor A. C. Chibnall, M.A., Sc.D., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry was held in the North British Station Hotel, Edinburgh, on March 13th, 1947, with Professor G. F. Marrian in the Chair. Professor Chibnall gave an account of the great advances which have been made recently in the analysis of protein hydrolysates and the bearing of the results on attempts to elucidate the structure of proteins such as insulin, edostin, and some hæmoglobins. A discussion followed. Dr. Ames proposed the vote of thanks to the Lecturer which was accorded with enthusiasm.

EXETER.

"Some Reactions of Free Radicals," by Dr. W. A. Waters, M.A., F.R.I.C.

A meeting was held at the Washington Singer Laboratories, University College, Exeter, on February 21st, 1947, with Professor H. T. S. Britton in the Chair.

Dr. Waters delivered the substance of his Tilden Lecture which was much appreciated by the audience. He traced the rapid development of this subject over the last few years, outlining the various experimental methods which are now available, and showed its bearing on such subjects as polymerisation, and catalytic oxidation of oils.

GLASGOW.

"The Composition and Structure of Proteins," by Professor A. C. Chibnall, M.A., Sc.D., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry, was held in the University, Glasgow, on March 14th, 1947.

Beginning with an account of modern chemical methods which combine to give reliability and near-completeness in analyses of the amino-acid content of proteins, Professor Chibnall proceeded to discuss the actual results and, in the case of insulin, to outline the further evidence which points to a molecular structure still incompletely detailed, but not beyond the scope of ultimate synthesis. After an interesting discussion, Dr. S. H. Tucker proposed a vote of thanks which was accorded with enthusiasm.

Meeting for the reading of original papers.

The Annual General Meeting of local Fellows was held in the Royal Technical College, Glasgow, on March 21st, 1947, and was followed by a meeting for the reading of original papers. The following papers were read and discussed:

"The Chemistry of Penicillin," by Professor Wilson Baker, M.A., D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the Leeds University Chemical Society was held on February 25th, 1947, in the Chemistry Department, University of Leeds, with Dr. J. W. Baker in the Chair.

Professor Baker described in detail the researches carried out in this country and in the United States leading to the elucidation of the structure of penicillin and discussed possibilities regarding its synthesis and the modification of the molecule. At the conclusion of the lecture Professor F. Challenger proposed and Mr. J. Gaunt seconded a vote of thanks which was carried with acclamation. The lecture was preceded by films entitled "Nose has it," "Bakelite," and "Penicillin."

LIVERPOOL.

"Recent Advances in the Chemistry of Starch and Glycogen," by Professor E. L. Hirst, M.A., D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the Royal Institute of Chemistry, the Society of Chemical Industry, the British Association of Chemists, and the Liverpool University Chemical Society, was held at Liverpool University on Thursday, February 20th, 1947. Professor A. Robertson, F.R.S., who was in the Chair, welcomed a party of students from Manchester University.

Professor Hirst read a most stimulating paper and a vigorous discussion followed. The vote of thanks proposed by Dr. A. McGookin was carried with acclamation.

MANCHESTER.

Meeting for the reading of original papers.

A joint meeting with the local section of the Royal Institute of Chemistry was held on March 13th, 1947, in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre, Manchester University, and the following papers were read and discussed:

SHEFFIELD.

"Homolytic Reactions," by Professor D. H. Hey, D.Sc., Ph.D., F.R.I.C.

A joint meeting with the University Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre of the University on February 27th, 1947, with Professor R. D. Haworth, D.Sc., Ph.D., F.R.S., in the Chair. Proceeding from the classification of organic reactions into Heterolytic and Homolytic processes, Professor Hey showed that the latter class involved free radicals, such as occurred in many pyrogenic and photochemical reactions, in the electrolysis of organic compounds, and in many chain reactions. Compounds such as the alkali diazotates, the nitrosoacylarylamines, the arylazotriphenylmethanes, and the di-acyl peroxides, decomposed in solution, according to a true unimolecular process, to give highly active free radicals of short life; their reactions showed typical characteristics which clearly differentiated them from nucleophilic and electrophilic

reagents. As examples Professor Hey discussed the abnormal addition of hydrogen bromide to ethylenic compounds (Peroxide Effect), the processes of atomic chlorination and of addition polymerisation, and the use of Grignard reagents in the presence of cobaltous chloride. It was noteworthy that many compounds hitherto regarded as inert have been found to be reactive if the experimental conditions favoured a homolytic

After a lively discussion, a vote of thanks, proposed by Dr. A. H. Lamberton, and seconded by Mr. A. R. Pinder, was carried with enthusiasm.

SOUTHAMPTON.

"The Chemistry of Vitamin A," by Professor Sir Ian Heilbron, D.S.O., D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the University College of Southampton Chemical Society was held in the Physics Lecture Theatre, University College, Southampton, on February 28th, 1947, Dr. K. R. Webb, Local Representative, being in the Chair.

Professor Heilbron outlined in a clear and fascinating manner various methods by which substances related to Vitamin A, and having Vitamin A activity, have been built up and gave a valuable critical survey of these methods. A vigorous discussion followed the lecture, and a vote of thanks, proposed by Professor N. K. Adam, was carried with enthusiasm by the large audience.

A joint meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry was held in the Chemistry Department, Marischal College, Aberdeen, on March 20th, 1947.

Professor Hirst outlined earlier work on the structure of starch, much of which did not appreciate that starch was a mixture of amylose and amylopectin. Later work, particularly graded hydrolysis of methylated starch and enzymatic hydrolysis by β -amylose, indicates a laminated structure for amylopectin and a long unbranched chain structure for amylose. The constitution of glycogen has been determined in a similar way. Recently, synthetic substances similar to amylose, amylopectin, and glycogen have been obtained by the action of phosphorylases on glucose-1-phosphate.

SOUTH WALES.

"Gammexane, some properties of this new insecticide," by Dr. L. J. Burrage.

A meeting was held jointly with the Cardiff and District Section of the Royal Institute of Chemistry and the South Wales Section of the Society of Chemical Industry on March 19th, 1947, at the Technical College, Newport, with Mr. W. D. Williams in the Chair.

Dr. Burrage compared the properties of gammexane and its α -, β -, and δ -isomers and discussed some of the structural problems involved. The peculiarly high insecticidal properties of the γ -compound were shown to be only one of many interesting aspects of the chemistry of these substances which emerged in the course of the researches described.

After a good discussion a vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Mr. Ront, seconded by Mr. Cooper and carried with enthusiasm.

MEETING OF COUNCIL.

A meeting of Council was held on Thursday, May 1st, 1947.

Reports from the Publication Committee (May 1st, 1947) and the Joint Library Committee were received.

The Council had under consideration the programme for the Session 1947—1948 and the question of appointing Hugo Müller, Pedler and Tilden Lecturers received attention.

The thanks of Council have been conveyed to Messrs. E. T. H. Bucknell, H. H. Hughes, R. S. Hughes, and G. S. Ward for gifts of the Society's publications.

It was noted with pleasure that the Anglo-Iranian Oil Company had entered into a Deed of Covenant for the gift of £50 per annum to the Society to be used for current general purposes.

The Report of the Finance and General Purposes Committee (April 17th, 1947) and the filling of vacancies on the Publication Committee and Finance and General Purposes Committee was considered.

The Council received with pleasure a letter of congratulation on the attainment of the Society's Centenary from the President of the Society of Antiquaries.

An invitation to the Society to be represented at the XVIII Session of the International Geological Congress, to be held in London in 1948, was received.

It was agreed to support the application of the Society of Dyers and Colourists for a Royal Charter.

Approval was given to a proposal by the Chemical Council that the Society of Public Analysts should participate in the joint membership scheme.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON

SHEFFIELD.

"Bond Lengths in Aromatic Hydrocarbons," by Professor J. Monteath Robertson, M.A., D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the University Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre of the University on May 1st, 1947, with Professor R. D. Haworth, D.Sc., Ph.D., F.R.S., in the Chair.

After an introductory sketch of the methods which may be used to determine bond lengths, and the correlation of such measurements with the character of the bond, Professor Robertson proceeded to give detailed descriptions of the structures of pyrene, 1:2:5:6-dibenzanthracene, and coronene as determined by X-ray diffraction. Attention was drawn to the extent of the agreement between the experimentally determined bond lengths and the values calculated from the contributions of the various Kekulé structures.

Following a discussion, a vote of thanks proposed by Mr. W. Moser and seconded by Mr. S. E. Miles was accorded heartily by the meeting.

"The Study of Antibiotics," by Sir Howard Florey, F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the University Chemical Society was held in the General Lecture Theatre of the University on May 8th, 1947, with Professor R. D. Haworth, D.Sc., Ph.D., F.R.S., in the Chair.

Sir Howard Florey reviewed the progress which had been made since the pioneer observation of Pasteur that one living organism could inhibit the growth of another, and drew attention to the great advances made in recent years through the co-operation of the chemist, and of the chemical engineer, with the biologist. A sketch was given of the methods of testing for antibiotic activity, of isolation of the active substance, and of evaluation of the usefulness of individual antibiotics in medicine.

A vote of thanks proposed by Professor E. J. Wayne and seconded by Dr. P. R. Carter was accorded heartily by the meeting.

MEETING OF COUNCIL.

A meeting of Council was held on Thursday, June 5th, 1947.

Reports of the meeting of the Publication Committee held on June 5th, 1947, and of the Centenary Executive Committee held on May 1st, 1947, were adopted.

The thanks of Council were conveyed to Mr. A. J. Faulks and Miss P. Turner Jones

for gifts of the Society's publications.

Council was advised that the Chemical Council had agreed to grant the sum of £900 8s. 6d. to balance the maintenance costs of the Library of the Society in respect of the financial year ending December 31st, 1946. Details of the Chemical Council's proposals for the division of Library maintenance costs payable in 1947 were also received.

A report from the Joint Library Committee which met on May 28th, 1947, was received. The Council discussed in some detail the financial position of the Society in the face of the very greatly increased costs of the printing, publication, and administrative services and some proposals as to the manner in which these increased costs should be met were adopted. These proposals have been submitted to the Chemical Council for consideration and details of the proposals will be published in due course.

The Council were advised that no notice of resignation having been given by any constituent body within the specified period the existing agreement for the continuation of the Chemical Council, which was due to expire on June 30th, 1947, will be continued automatically for a further period of three years.

Certain formal and financial items of business were also transacted.

BRITISH STANDARDS INSTITUTION.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON

EXETER.

"Clay," by Dr. G. Nagelschmidt.

A highly successful joint meeting with the British Rheologists' Club was held in the Washington Singer Laboratories on Friday, May 16th, 1947, being attended by about thirty visitors and some fifty students and chemists from Exeter and district.

Dr. Nagelschmidt gave an outline of modern views on the structure of clays and of the techniques used in investigating them, and showed how wide was the field of interests to which research on clay is useful. He was followed by Dr. D. M. C. MacEwan who described some new work on the X-ray patterns of clays containing various organic absorbates, and drew some interesting conclusions as to the way in which the organic molecules were oriented between the sheets of the clay.

After the tea interval, Mr. H. Macey spoke on the rheology of clay and dealt with both the theoretical and the practical aspects of the manufacture of pottery and refractories.

On the Saturday, the party visited the china clay workings at Hendra and the laboratories of Lovering Pochin & Co. at St. Austell.

SOUTHAMPTON.

"Electron Diffraction," by Professor G. I. Finch, D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the Portsmouth and District Chemical Society and the Chemical Society of University College, Southampton, was held at Portsmouth Municipal College on June 6th, 1947, with Mr. G. N. S. Farrand in the Chair.

After a preliminary discussion of the technique of the electron diffraction camera, its construction and use, Professor Finch gave a brilliant account of various phenomena observed, particularly in the study of surface structure, including evidence for the essentially non-crystalline nature of the Beilby layer on certain polished surfaces and for the recrystallisation which occurs on others. The lecture was illustrated by numerous excellent slides.

A vote of thanks, proposed by Dr. K. R. Webb, Local Representative, was carried with acclamation by the large audience.

"Some Aspects of the Chemistry of Penicillin," by Sir Ian Heilbron, D.S.O., D.Sc., LL.D., F.R.S.

An Inaugural Meeting was held in the Assembly Hall of the University College on June 6th, 1947, with Professor Brynmor Jones in the Chair.

After expressing his pleasure at the establishment of a local section in Hull, and emphasising the importance of the local sections in stimulating interest in chemical research and development, Sir Ian gave a brief summary of the discovery and value of penicillin and went on to give a very lucid and fascinating account of its chemistry.

INCREASED PRICES OF PUBLICATIONS.

Subscription renewal notices for the year 1948 are now being despatched to Fellows paying separate and joint subscriptions.

The particular attention of all Fellows is drawn to the revised prices of publications which the Council have decided should be adopted for the coming year.

Rising costs of printing, paper, and the generally increased cost of all administrative services have made it necessary to draw heavily upon the special reserve fund which was built up during the War to meet the additional cost of publishing the accumulated papers of wartime research without extra cost to the Fellows.

Withdrawals from the reserve fund must be very substantially reduced and the Council have decided that this can only be done by raising the Fellowship price of the Society's publications.

In addition, in the case of separate Fellows of the Society the mode of choice of publications has been amended and will be as follows:

(i) Fellows paying a subscription of £3 10s.

To receive publications to the value of £3 without further charge, and to make additional purchases over and above this amount at the reduced rate to Fellows.

(ii) Fellows paying the reduced subscription of £1 15s.

To receive publications to the value of f_1 10s, without further charge, and to make additional purchases at the reduced rate to Fellows up to a further f_1 10s,

The Council feel that the adoption of this new method of choice for separate Fellows is the most equitable arrangement since an increased expenditure will only be incurred by those Fellows who take the more expensive publications and the extra amount which they will be called upon to pay will be in proportion to the number of publications they desire to receive. In fact Fellows who elect to receive the *Journal*, *Annual Reports*, and *Quarterly Reviews* will not be required to pay more than the basic subscription of £3 10s.

The new prices of publications will also apply to Fellows paying a joint subscription. Under the Joint Scheme, however, the cost incurred by the Fellow is already related to the cost of the publications selected.

SURVEY OF SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNOLOGICAL MAN-POWER.

The Report on Scientific Man-Power (Cmd. 6824) which was based on the work of a Committee presided over by Sir Alan Barlow, emphasises the need for increasing the output of qualified scientists and technologists. In order that the part which Universities and Technical Colleges will be called upon to play in this connection may be estimated with greater accuracy than has been possible hitherto, the Government Advisory Council on Scientific Policy has asked for the help of the Technical and Scientific Register of the Ministry of Labour and National Service in measuring the existing man-power in the Scientific and Technological fields. The Ministry is anxious that every qualified chemist should receive the letter and accompanying questionnaire which has recently been issued. Fellows, who for any reason did not receive these documents, are asked to apply for them to the Technical and Scientific Register, York House, Kingsway, London, W.C. 2, or to any Regional Appointments Office of the Ministry.

MEETING OF COUNCIL.

A meeting of Council was held on Thursday, November 6th, 1947.

A Report from the Publication Committee was adopted.

Dr. G. Baddeley was unanimously appointed joint Local Representative for Manchester in succession to Dr. A. E. Gillam, who had resigned.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON

BRISTOL.

"The Oxidation of Phenols," by Professor R. D. Haworth, D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the local sections of the Royal Institute of Chemistry, the Society of Chemical Industry, and the University Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Department of the University on November 6th, 1947.

Professor Haworth discussed the general types of oxidation reaction of phenols including biological applications. After consideration of the dehydrogenation of *iso*eugenol, the lecturer emphasised the importance of propylphenols in the chemistry of natural products, and described the conversion of ferulic acid into a lactone of the lignan type. He outlined a mechanism of the derivation of terpenoid structures by fusion of the aromatic nucleus of propylphenols, and concluded with an account of recent work on purpurogallin.

EDINBURGH.

"Diffusion in Biological Processes," by Dr. Phillip Eggleton.

A joint meeting with the Society of Chemical Industry and the Royal Institute of Chemistry was held on November 13th, 1947, in the North British Station Hotel, with Dr. W. M. Ames in the Chair.

Dr. Phillip Eggleton dealt with the diffusion of salts, histidine, urea, carnosine, glucose, etc., into and out of muscle under various conditions, and the question of the diffusion of gases such as nitrogen and carbon dioxide out of animal tissue when the pressure was rapidly reduced was also dealt with.

A discussion followed and Dr. Illingworth proposed a vote of thanks to the lecturer which was enthusiastically received.

EIRE.

"The Oxidation of Phenols," by Professor R. D. Haworth, D.Sc., F.R.S.

A joint meeting with the Werner Society was held in the Department of Chemistry, Trinity College, Dublin, on October 31st, 1947. Professor E. A. Werner presided.

Professor Haworth discussed the oxidation reaction of phenols involving (a) the introduction of additional atoms of oxygen and the formation of polyhydroxy-compounds and semiquinones, (b) the removal of hydrogen atoms with the production of quinones, peroxides, and derivatives of diphenyl, and (c) the fission of the aromatic nucleus.

Some important biological applications including the probable relationship of tyrosine with homogentisinic acid, adrenaline, thyroxine, and melanin were noted, and reference was made to the rearrangement of the semiquinones. After consideration of the dehydrogenation of isoeugenol, the lecturer emphasised the importance of propylphenols in the chemistry of natural products and described experiments which had led to the conversion of ferulic acid into a lactone of the lignan type. A possible mechanism for the derivation of terpenoid structures by the fusion of the aromatic nucleus of propyl-phenols was outlined and the lecturer concluded with an account of recent work on purpurogallin. The phenylcyclopentadienone formula of Willstätter and Heise was now untenable and strong degradative and synthetical evidence has been obtained in favour of a benzylcycloheptatrienolone structure. The mechanism of the conversion of pyrogallol into purpurogallin was briefly discussed.

A vote of thanks for this extremely interesting lecture was proposed by Professor R. A. O'Meara and seconded by Professor T. S. Wheeler.

SHEFFIELD.

"The Hydrogen Bond in Organic Chemistry", by Professor L. Hunter, D.Sc., F.R.I.C.

A joint meeting with the University Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre of the University on November 13th, 1947, with Professor R. D. Haworth. D.Sc., F.R.S., in the Chair.

Professor Hunter gave a historical sketch of the evidence for the existence of hydrogen bonds, proceeded to deal with the methods available for their detection, and finally gave a stimulating account of his own work on association and mesohydric tautomerism.

Following a discussion, a vote of thanks proposed by Dr. A. H. Lamberton and seconded by Mr. S. E. Miles was accorded heartily by the meeting.
