Members will know that the responsibility for the organisation of Society events passes between the different national ceramic societies in Europe. Colleagues in the Netherlands Ceramic Society nurtured the European Ceramic Society through the first two years of its existence, terminating in the first Conference held in Maastricht in June 1989. May we encourage colleagues throughout Europe to share with the Spanish Ceramic and Glass Society in making these two years a memorable period in our Society's development.
