

Instructions to Authors

Submission

Online submission

Authors should submit their articles electronically by using the Journal of Computational Physics online submission tool (<http://www.editorialmanager.com/jcomp/>). Authors can upload their article as a LaTeX, Microsoft® (MS) Word®, PostScript or Adobe® Acrobat® PDF document via the online submission tool. The system generates an Adobe Acrobat PDF version of the article, which is used for the reviewing process. It is crucial that all graphical and tabular elements be placed within the text, so that the file is suitable for reviewing. Authors, Reviewers and Editors send and receive all correspondence via the online submission system or e-mail, and no paper correspondence is necessary. Note: Compuscripts submitted are converted into PDF for the review process but may need to be edited after acceptance to follow journal standards. For this an “editable” file format is necessary. See further general instructions on how to prepare your article below.

Hard copy + disk submission

In exceptional cases, where electronic submission is impossible, authors can submit their manuscript in triplicate directly to the following address:

Please note that this type of submission will have a significantly slower publication time than electronic submission via the Journal of Computational Physics online submission tool.

Review process

After refereeing, the manuscript will be finally judged by one of the Associate Editors, who has the right to accept or reject a paper. Submission of a paper will be taken to imply that it represents original work not previously published, that it is not being considered elsewhere for publication, and that if accepted for publication it will not be published elsewhere in the same form, in any language, without the consent of the Publisher.

Manuscript preparation

All manuscripts should be written in good English. Paper copies of the text should be prepared with double line spacing and wide margins, on numbered sheets.

Structure. Please adhere to the following order of presentation: Article title, Author(s), Affiliation(s), Abstract, Keywords, Main text, Acknowledgements, Appendices, References, Figure captions, Tables.

Corresponding author. For hard copy manuscripts, the name, complete postal address, telephone and fax numbers and the e-mail address of the corresponding author should be given on the first page of the manuscript.

References

References to other work should be consecutively numbered in the text using square brackets and listed by number in the Reference list. Please refer to the more detailed instructions on the journal website for examples.

Illustrations

For online submissions, electronic graphics are mandatory. See online instructions at: <http://authors.elsevier.com/journal/jcp>. For paper submissions, the Publisher welcomes electronic graphics accompanying accepted manuscripts. Hardcopy figures should be unmounted unless part of a composite figure. Any scale markers should be inserted on the photograph, not drawn below it.

Colour plates. If, together with your accepted article, you submit usable colour figures then Elsevier will ensure, at no additional charge, that these figures will appear in colour on the web (e.g., ScienceDirect and other sites) regardless of whether or not these illustrations are reproduced in colour in the printed version. For colour reproduction in

print, you will receive information regarding the costs from Elsevier after receipt of your accepted article. For further information on the preparation of electronic artwork, please see <http://www.elsevier.com/locate/author-artwork>.

Please note. Because of technical complications which can arise by converting colour figures to grey scale (for the printed version should you not opt for colour in print) please submit in addition usable black and white prints corresponding to all the colour illustrations.

After acceptance

Notification. You will be notified by the Editor of the acceptance of your article and invited to supply an electronic version of the accepted text, if this is not already available.

Copyright transfer. You will be asked to transfer the copyright of the article to the Publisher. This transfer will ensure the widest possible dissemination of information.

Proofs. One set of page proofs in PDF format will be sent by e-mail to the corresponding Author (if we do not have an e-mail address then paper proofs will be sent by post). Elsevier now sends PDF proofs which can be annotated; for this you will need to download Adobe Reader version 7 available free from <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html>. Instructions on how to annotate PDF files will accompany the proofs.

If you do not wish to use the PDF annotations function, you may list the corrections (including replies to the Query Form) and return to Elsevier in an e-mail. Please list your corrections quoting line number. If, for any reason, this is not possible, then mark the corrections and any other comments (including replies to the Query Form) on a printout of your proof and return by fax, or scan the pages and e-mail, or by post.

Please use this proof only for checking the typesetting, editing, completeness and correctness of the text, tables and figures. Significant changes to the article as accepted for publication will only be considered at this stage with permission from the Editor. We will do everything possible to get your article published quickly and accurately. Therefore, it is important to ensure that all of your corrections are sent back to us in one communication: please check carefully before replying, as inclusion of any subsequent corrections cannot be guaranteed. Proofreading is solely your responsibility. Note that Elsevier may proceed with the publication of your article if no response is received.

Author benefits

No page charges. Publishing in Journal of Computational Physics is free.

Free offprints. The corresponding author, at no cost, will be provided with a PDF file of the article via e-mail or, alternatively, 25 free paper offprints. The PDF file is a watermarked version of the published article and includes a cover sheet with the journal cover image and a disclaimer outlining the terms and conditions of use.

Discount. Contributors to Elsevier journals are entitled to a 25% discount on all Elsevier books.

Digital Object Identifier

Academic Press assigns a unique digital object identifier (DOI) to every article it publishes. The DOI appears on the title page of the article. It is assigned after the article had been accepted for publication and persists throughout the lifetime of the article. Because of its persistence, it can be used to query Academic Press information on the article during the production process to find the article on the Internet through various Web sites, and to cite the article in academic references. When a reference to an online version of an article is being cited and that reference has yet to appear in print, authors may want to include the DOI, as volume and page information is not always available.
