SYMPOSIUM ON PURITY DETERMINATION BY THERMAL METHODS

Baltimore, 25 April, 1983

A call for papers is issued for a Symposium on Purity Determinations by Thermal Methods to be held on 25 April 1983 in Baltimore, Maryland. The symposium is sponsored by ASTM Committee E-37 on Thermal Measurements.

Papers are sought treating all theoretic, practical, and speculative aspects of purity determinations with special emphasis on calorimetric purity methods. Also encouraged are papers dealing with theoretical treatments, original research, established applications, and comparisons to other techniques in addition to historical and review paper perspectives.

A special technical publication on the symposium proceedings is anticipated by ASTM. A nonprofit organization based in Philadelphia, ASTM is an internationally recognized management process for the development of standards and the exchange of information in this and numerous other areas.

Scientific Sessions

Scientific sessions of the Seminar will consist of invited plenary lectures, short original communications and panel discussions on selected topics. The plenary lectures (45 min) will review the present state of the particular fields of the thermochemical analysis or reaction calorimetry. A full list of invited lectures will be given in the 2nd circular. Other short communications (15 min) will present original works concerning different problems and experience in solution thermochemistry and analysis. Topics of the panel discussions will be specified in the 2nd circular according to the fields of the participants' interests.

General Information

The working languages of the Seminar will be English, Russian and German. Abstracts of the lectures and communications (each of them 1–2 pages) will be distributed to the participants during registration. The accommodation for all participants will be reserved at the Esplanade Hotel, Mariánské Lázně (West Bohemian Spa).
