REPORT OF THE PLANNING COMMITTEE

The work of the planning committee during the past year has been an effort to correlate as much as possible the work of the various committees of the Society. Letters were sent out to the chairmen of the various committees last fall and several times since. It appears that on account of the great amount of business of the several laboratories that it has been very difficult to get results of the committee together in time so as to embody them in a complete report.

The Committee on Basic Research, Mr. Barrows, Chairman, made a very full report, covering practically the same ground as that published in the Cotton Oil Press last fall. Mr. Malowan has turned in a very satisfactory report on seed analysis.
