## Marine Corps to Open Bids March 16th

The Depot Quartermaster, U. S. Marine Corps, 1100 South Broad Street, Philadelphia, on March 16, 1932, at 11:00 o'clock A. M. will open sealed proposals for furnishing the following soap and cleaning supplies, to be delivered at the points specified: 50,000 lbs. ordinary laundry soap, 12 oz. cakes, for Sewalls Point, Va.; 55,000 lbs. ordinary laundry soap, 12 oz. cakes, for San Francisco; (all following items for delivery to the Depot Quartermaster, Marine Corps Warehouse, Philadelphia), 95,000 lbs. ordinary laundry soap, 12 oz. cakes; 40,000 lbs. soap powder in 1 lb. cartons; 600 lbs. automobile soap in 5 lb. cans; 3,000 lbs. automobile soap in 25 lb. cans; 5,000 lbs. grit cake soap for fine work in 9 to 10 oz. cakes, 100 cakes per case; 1,400 16-oz. cans of saddle soap; 27,500 lbs. grit cake soap, for scouring and scrubbing, 9 to 10 oz. cakes, 100 cakes per case; 4,688 lbs.

white floating toilet soap, 5 oz. cakes, 100 cakes per case; 5,500 lbs. trisodium phosphate, packed in 4 oz. cartons, one hundred cartons per corrugated board case, two corrugated cases per wooden case for export; 20,000 cans liquid metal polish, pint cans, 5 cans per substantial wooden case.
