Payments to producers for acreage adjustment in 1935 will be measured by the quantity of peanuts harvested in 1934 at the rate of \$8 per ton. This will insure the contract signer of a larger return from his crop than the noncooperator will receive, although the plan probably will yield returns to nonsigners somewhat higher than they would have received had there been no peanut program.

The benefit payment will be made on the entire 1934 harvested crop of contract signers regardless of the use to which the harvested peanuts are put. In addition, a producer signing a contract will be given an opportunity to divert any part of the 1934 crop to use as feed or in the manufacture of oil up to 20 per cent of his harvested crop. Diversion on the part of growers signing contracts will be optional and would consist of selling peanuts to a peanut oil manufacturer who agrees in writing to use such peanuts for oil; baling peanuts on the vine and using them for food; or baling peanuts on the vine and selling them for feed to an agency approved by the Secretary of Agriculture under regulations to be announced.

Only one method of diversion may be selected by any one producer and the diversion payment will be made only on peanuts diverted in the manner selected. No payment of any kind will be made, however, on peanuts that are hogged-down or undug.

The rate of payment to farmers for diversion would be \$20 a ton for Virginia type peanuts; \$15 a ton for Spanish and \$10 a ton for Runner type peanuts.

ANNUAL BOWLING TOURNAMENT

The Annual Bowling Tournament, which has been a feature of the past Chicago Conventions, was held at the beautiful Medinah Club again this year. In spite of a great deal of competition from the bridge party and dance which ran simultaneously, 54 entrants competed in the singles and five-man team events. In order to accommodate all who desired to bowl, the tournament this year was run in two sessions, the first starting Thursday afternoon at 4:30 and continuing until 6:30 and the second session beginning at 8:30 and finishing around 10:30.

A large number of prizes were offered, the Amaizo Challenge Cup, of course, being the most coveted prize. The American Maize Products Company's "Amaizos" topped all entrants in the five-man team entries to take home this trophy. This is the Amaizos' first leg on the cup, which must be won three times to be the permanent possession of any competing team. It will be recalled that this same Amaizo team walked away with the Nuchar Cup in three successive victories. The Amaizo Challenge Trophy, now in competition, was presented by Mr. R. E. Daly of the American Maize Products Company. Last year it was won by Lever Bros. who gave it up this year only after a struggle which lasted until the last ball was rolled. The Lever Bros. team are now making plans for taking it back home after the 1935 tournament.

So far he has only collected three or four slide rules in several golf tournaments. A special prize for an individual never having won in an A. O. C. S. tournament was won by E.
