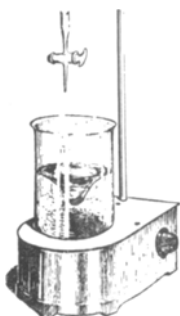

First Revisions of Methods Are Announced By Society

THE first Revisions of the 1946 edition of the Official Methods of Analysis published by the American Oil Chemists' Society under the direction of V. C. Mehlenbacher, technical editor, are now available for distribution. They will be entitled 1947 Revisions and, like the original Methods, will be loose-leaf in format and 6x9 inches in size.

It is suggested that everyone who has purchased the second, or 1946 edition of the Methods, should bring it up to date by also purchasing the 1947 Revisions. These Revisions are embodied in the revision of Trading Rule 102 announced by the National Soybean Processors Association, effective on all sales contracted for shipment after September 30, 1947.

Other Revisions to keep the 1946 Methods up to date will be announced by the Society in the future, as the Uniform Methods Committee approves such changes.
