Short Course on Drying Oils Opens August 7 with 20 Speakers

TN LESS than a month the third annual short course with an enrollment of more than 100 will be held on the campus of the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis: August 7-11, 1950, at the Continuation Center. Sponsors are the American Oil Chemists' Society and the Federation of Paint and Varnish Production Clubs. The program was published in full in the April issue of the Journal, and information about speakers, all of them in the drying oil industry, has been presented in succeeding issues. Local committee on arrangements comprises S. O. Sorensen, Archer-Daniels-Midland Company, J. E. Kortum, Minnesota Paints inc., and W. H. Goss, Pillsbury Mills inc. Assisting them is Fred E. Berger of the

university staff. W. O. Lundberg of Hormel Institute, Austin, Minn., is chairman during the week.

D. H. Wheeler of General Mills inc. will speak on the chemistry of drying oils, Monday morning. He is director of technical sales and service of the Chemical Division in Minneapolis. He joined the General Mills staff in 1943 and has been head of the chemical research department, responsible for the development of fatty acids, drying oils, synthetic waxes, soybean products, and other new organic chemicals. Previously he

had had four years service as senior chemist with the U. S. D. A., Northern Regional Research Laboratory, Peoria, Ill. In the fall of 1947 he was named one of the nation's 10 most able fats and oils chemists by the Chicago section of the American Chemical Society.

Under the general theme of drying oils the subjects to be discussed by a score of speakers are production, processing, and uses. Field trips will include a visit to the production mill of Minnesota Paints inc. on August 8, a visit to the research laboratories of A-D-M
