Meals will be served in the Commons across the street, and lectures will be given in the Engineering auditorium one block away.

The short course is being given under the direction of the Education Committee of the Society, of which J. P. Harris is chairman, and its subcommittee, headed by Dr. Snell. University officials cooperating with the Society are M. A. Chaffee, director of the University Extension Division, and P. A. van der Meulen, head of the chemical division.


