Receive Oberly Award

Ralph W. Planck and Frank C. Pack, research chemists of the Southern Regional Research Laboratory of the USDA Bureau of Agricultural and Industrial Chemistry at New Orleans, La., and Dorothy B. Skau, librarian of the New Orleans Branch of the Department of Agriculture Library, have received the Oberly Memorial Award for the best bibliography in the field of agriculture. The announcement was made recently at the 72nd annual conference of the American Library Association in Los Angeles.

The bibliography, a processed publication entitled "Abstract Bibliography of the Chemistry and Technology of Tung Products, 1875-1950" is the only up-to-date and comprehensive survey in English of the nearly 3,000 articles and patents relating to the tung tree, the processing of its fruit, and the chemistry and technology of the oil and meal that have appeared throughout the world over the past 75 years.
