## Short Course for 1955 Is Approved by Board

APPROVAL of a short course in 1955 was among the actions of the Governing Board of the American Oil Chemists' Society in session October 10, 1954 at the Radisson hotel, Minneapolis, with C. E. Morris, president, in the chair. Based on a recommendation by G. A. Crapple, chairman of the Education Committee, the course will probably be devoted to analytical techniques, statistical quality control and analytical control, and general background on the chemistry of fats and oils.

Other actions were as follows:

- 1. approval of consideration of setting up a student membership
- 2. authorization of an increase of \$1 a year in the subscription rate for the Journal (to \$6 for one year and \$11 for two years), effective in 1955, as recommended by A. R. Baldwin, chairman of the Journal Committee
- 3. approval of emeritus status for E. R. Barrow of Memphis, Tenn., a charter member of the Society and president in 1912, and for E. T. Marceau of St. Petersburg, Fla., a member since 1925.
- 4. acceptance of the resignation of R. W. Bates from the Referee Board and appointment of E. R. Hahn, Hahn Laboratories, Columbia, S. C., to fill the unexpired term

The Board received a formal request for section status from the president of the North Central Oil Chemists' Society, Karl F. Mattil. This was referred to a committee comprising W. A. Peterson, chairman, H. C. Black, and T. H. Hopper.
