Detergent Abstracts and Papers Available

The American Society for Testing Materials, 1916 Race street, Philadelphia 2, Pa., has announced the availability of two detergent publications, "Bibliographical Abstracts of Methods for Analysis of Synthetic Detergents" and six "Pa-pers on Soaps and Other Detergents." The abstracts contain 20 pages and cost \$1.25. They are presented to keep pace with the accelerated growth of the synthetic detergent industry and cover the years 1929-1951.

The first five papers were presented at the March 1953 meeting of ASTM Committee D-12 on Soaps and Other Detergents and are reprinted from the ASTM Bulletin. The sixth paper was added because of its related interest. The group of papers has a self-cover and costs 75 cents. Both the abstracts and the six papers are available at a combination price of \$1.50.

ASTM Will Publish Directory

The Directory of Commercial and College Laboratories, hitherto compiled and published by the National Bureau of Standards of the U.S. Department of Commerce, will be published in the future by the American Society for Testing Materials, according to a recent agreement between the two organizations. First published in 1927, the Directory has been periodically revised. It provides information concerning the location of testing laboratories together with the types of commodities and the nature of the investigations the laboratories are prepared to undertake.

The directory is designed to be of assistance to the large number of purchasers who are not equipped to make their own acceptance tests and therefore have hesitated to buy on

specifications.
