

# Renfrew Joins Faculty at University of Idaho

ALCOLM M. RENFREW has been appointed professor of chemistry and head of the department of physical sciences at the University of Idaho, Moscow, Idaho. He will assume these duties on February 1, 1959, following a trip to Europe to visit the physical science departments of universities and colleges in several countries.

Dr. Renfrew has been director of research and development for Spencer Kellogg and Sons, Buffalo, N. Y., since 1954 and has served in similar capacities for E. I. du Pont de Nemours and General Mills. He is the author of 21 technical papers and holds numerous patents in the chemi-

In joining the faculty at the University of Idaho, Dr. Renfrew will return to his alma mater, from which he was graduated in 1932 and received his master's degree in 1934. He was awarded a Ph.D. degree from the University of Minnesota in 1938. While doing advanced work, he was a teaching assistant at both Idaho and Minnesota.

# Transfers Castor Bean Study

N EXPANDED PROGRAM of research aimed at finding new and improved uses for castor-bean oil and other A and improved uses 101 castor results will be undertaken at the Western Division USDA Utilization Research and Development Division, U.S.D.A., Albany, Calif. Research on castor beans has previously been conducted at the Southern Utilization Research and Development Division, New Orleans, La.

The growing interest in castor beans as a crop for California and the southwest was a major factor in the decision to shift the expanded program to the western division. Castor research already under way in the southern division will continue through December 1958, when personnel and facilities on this work will begin research on other new crops

with industrial possibilities.

Southern Division findings have contributed to the use of castor oil in the manufacture of foam plastics, and a new solvent-extraction process eliminates the need for prepressing seeds of high oil content. The southern and eastern divisions have made substantial progress toward destroying or inactivating ricin and an allergen, which remain in the meal or pomace after oil extraction, making it unfit for use as livestock feed or in industrial products. The western division will continue this work.

At present there are easter bean varieties particularly adapted to irrigated culture in California and Arizona, and others to dry land conditions in Oklahoma, New Mexico,

and Texas.
