

## Hold Short Course July 25-29

**E**DIBLE FATS will be the topic of the 1960 short course, to be conducted at the University of Illinois, Urbana, on July 25-29, according to J. C. Cowan, chairman of the Education Committee of the American Oil Chemists' Society. It is intended to be of value to plant operators, research and control scientists, technical salesmen, and others interested in edible fats.

Program chairman will be L. R. Dugan Jr. of the American Meat Institute Foundation, Chicago, Ill. Latest advances in technology as well as the present standard products, processes, and analyses will be discussed. The Food and Drug Act of 1957 and its effect will receive attention.

In charge of arrangements at the university will be Reid T. Milner, who is a past president of the Society and chairman of the first short course at Illinois.

## On the Educational Front

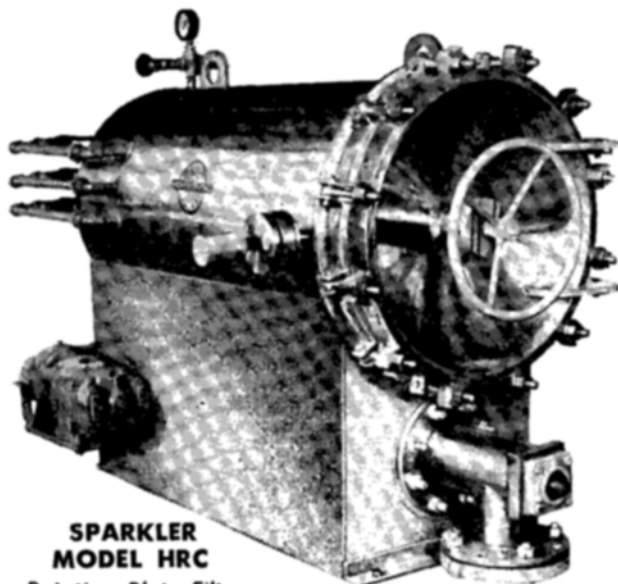
