

Bates to Head 1960-61 Slate of Candidates

AFTER THE DECEMBER 7, 1959, deadline for nominating suggestions, the Nominating and Election Committee, of which J. C. Konen is chairman, met in the national headquarters office on the 8th to consider the suggestions and make up a ticket for the mail balloting on officers to serve in the 1960-61 term. Active members were sent ballots on January 8, 1960, with a March 7 deadline for voting, preliminary to the 51st annual meeting April 4-6 at the Baker hotel in Dallas, Tex.

In accordance with the by-laws the candidate for the presidency will be unopposed: R. W. Bates (1942), who has served as vice president and membership chairman during the past year. He is research associate at Armour and Company, Chicago, Ill.

One candidate for the office of vice president will be A. R. Baldwin (1944), director of research, Cargill Inc., Minneapolis, Minn. He has been chairman of the Journal Committee and editor of the Journal since 1949, was editor of the 35-Year Cumulative Index of the Journal in 1952-53, and has been active in committees: Membership, Fat Analysis, Education, Fatty Acid Award, Bond Award, and Special Finances. He has been a member-at-large on the Governing Board in 1951, 1952, and again since 1955.

The other candidate will be R. C. Stillman (1934) of the factory service, analytical, Procter and Gamble Company, Cincinnati, O. He joined Procter and Gamble in 1929, served in the development department 1929-31, the research department 1931-45, and factory service since 1945. He has been a member of the Fat Analysis Committee, chairman of the Color Committee since 1953, and chairman of the A.O.C.S. delegates to the Inter-Society Color Council. He is also a member of Joint D-12, T-2 Committee on Synthetic Detergents. He became a member-at-large on the Governing Board of the Society in 1957 and secretary in 1958. As secretary he is *ex officio* on the Examination Board for referee chemists.

UNOPPOSED for the offices of secretary and treasurer, respectively, are K. F. Mattil (1944) and A. F. Kapecki (1937).

The former was first elected to the Governing Board in 1959 as member-at-large. He is associate director of research, Swift and Company, Chicago. He has been a member of the Education Committee since 1947 and chairman 1955-59.

The latter has been treasurer since 1953 and has served on the Chicago convention committee several times and been chairman in 1953 and 1956. He is now chairman of the new Convention Policy Committee. Professionally he is secretary of Wurster and Sanger Inc., Chicago, and secretary-treasurer of Wurster and Sanger International Inc.



D. S. Bolley

THERE are six candidates for member-at-large on the Board, with three to be elected: D. S. Bolley, G. C. Cavanagh, J. C. Harris, W. O. Lundberg, A. E. MacGee, and Raymond Reiser.

Mr. Bolley (1940) is technical director, Baker Castor Oil Company, Bayonne, N. J. He has been active in such committees as Fat Analysis and Seed and Meal Analysis and is a frequent contributor to the Journal. He has been named chairman of the New York fall meeting in 1960, succeeding the late W. A. Peterson.

Mr. Cavanagh (1946) is chief chemist and director of research, Ranchers Cotton Oil Company, Fresno, Calif. He is a charter member of the Northern California Section and is active in committee work. He has had several papers published in the Journal.

Elected to the Board in 1959, Mr. Harris (1944) is assistant director of research, Monsanto Chemical Company, Dayton, O. He was one of the committee in charge of the 1958 short course on detergents and is a frequent contributor to the Journal. He received the A.S.T.M. D-12 award in March 1959.
