The award will be given for an outstanding contribution to chemical education.

The 18th annual Statistical Quality Control Intensive Courses for the Chemical and Processing Industries will be held at the Rochester Institute of Technology, Rochester 8, N.Y., June 12-29.

Speakers for the Third Annual Symposium on New Coatings and New Coatings Raw Materials, June 5-8, 1961, at the North Dakota State University, Fargo, N.D., will include H.J. Harwood, Armour and Company, Chicago, and W.E. Link, Archer-Daniels-Midland Company, Minneapolis, according to A.E. Rheineck, professor of coatings technology.

• Obituaries

W.R. Stryker (1917), retired chemist, Southern Cotton Oil Company, Gretna, La., died on December 26, 1960, at the home of his daughter, Miss Elizabeth Stryker, in New York. He is also survived by a sister, Miss Clara Stryker of Somerville, N.J. Funeral services were held in Owego, N.Y.

He had been second vice president of the American Oil Chemists' Society in 1926, first vice president in 1928, and president in 1929. He and his daughter attended the 1960 fall meeting in New York.

The death of Harry J. Karakas (1956), employed by the Rodney Hunt Machine Company, has been reported to the Society office.

Roy Simpson Stovall Jr. (1957), chief chemist for Wesson Oil and Snowdrift Company Inc., Chicago, Ill., was found stabbed to death February 26, 1961, by a hunter in a remote section of Lake County, Ill. His automobile was later found in Waukegan, about 14 miles away from the spot where the body was discovered.

Mr. Stovall had been transferred in June 1960 from the New Orleans plant to Chicago. He lived at the La Grange Y.M.C.A. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Roy S. Stovall, live in Jackson, Miss.

William F. Geddes (1943), professor and chief of the Division of Agricultural Biochemistry at the University of Minnesota, died of a heart attack on January 7, 1961, in Mexico City, where he had gone for relief from a respiratory illness. He had been editor of Cereal Chemistry for 17 years, editor of Cereal Science Today at its inception, and an active member of the American Association of Cereal Chemists for many years. He was known in scientific circles throughout the world.

Henry E. Gross (1946), chief engineer, Stepan Chemical Company, Northfield, Ill., died November 5, 1960, according to word from his widow.
