Barbershop quartet singing has come a long way from the old days of haphazard harmonizing, according to Dr. Ackerman. It is now a well-organized, precise blending of voices. The international organization conducts contests between local groups and between regional groups comprising several states. There are contests at the national and international level as well. The international final competition, to be held in Philadelphia this year, will probably be attended by 20,000 to 30,000 persons, he prediets.

The best-known quartet, Dr. Ackerman believes, is the group called Buffalo Bills, who achieved fame by starring in "The Music Man." In the beginning it was just one of the quartets in the big organization.


