That evening the students will visit the George Eastman House, which has a world-famous museum of photography.

Housing for the course will be in Hoeing hall, a new dormitory. Meals will be served cafeteria style in the Women's Center (Danforth hall) on the campus. Lectures will be at the Lower Strong Auditorium.

Registration fee for the course will be \$65, plus room and board, payable in advance to the American Oil Chemists' Society at 35 E. Wacker drive, Chicago 1, Ill. Student fee will be \$16.50, plus room and board. Closing date for registration is July 13. All correspondence should be addressed to the Society office.
