The Program Committee is working to obtain a number of papers with a strong audience appeal, which cover a wide range of subject matter, and which will maintain the high quality standards established in previous meetings.

In order to expedite arrangement of the program in an orderly manner it is very desirable that the Program Chairman have titles and authors' names at the earliest possible date. Three (3) copies of abstracts of from 100-

300 words should be submitted with the title and authors' names. Approximately 15 minutes will be allotted each presentation. Type of slides, if any, to be presented should be noted.
