### Board Action Brings Schedule Changes

THE AOCS GOVERNING BOARD, prompted by growing discussion on the subject, reviewed the problems created by Technical Sessions and Technical Committee Meetings held concurrently during the past Annual Meetings. Several members of the Society have suggested that an attempt be made to separate these two major functions at our National Meetings. The National Program and Planning Committee was instructed by the Governing Board during the Toronto Meeting to explore the practicalities of offering equal opportunities to attend both the Sessions and the Committee Meetings. This effort has resulted in an announcement by the Atlanta Convention Committee that the Spring Meeting schedule will initiate a separation of these two functions. It is anticipated that the plan will be projected to future meeting schedules.


It is to be noted that the ladies program will include sightseeing tours, group breakfast, and ample time for shopping and relaxation.

## Crude Glycerine Production Continues Upward Trend

According to the U.S. Department of Commerce, production of crude glycerine (including synthetic) for the month of November 1962 was 23.4 million lb, up 1.0 million lb from October, but down 0.3 million lb from crude production reported for November 1961.

At the end of October, crude and refined glycerine stocks in the hands of producers totalled 59.5 million lb, up 5.0 million lb from October, but down 6.4 million lb from November last year.
