## AOAC Chemists to Meet

The Association of Official Agricultural Chemists will be hosts to some 1,000 scientists at the Shoreham Hotel, Washington, D.C., October 14-17, 1963, when they convene their 77th Annual Meeting. They will discuss and approve analytical methods for foods, drugs, cosmetics, feeds, fertilizers, pesticides, and other com-modities studied by the Association. The methods will be published in the AOAC Journal and later added to its compendium, "Official Methods of Analysis."

Harris for their outstanding contributions to analytical entomology and sanitation of foods and drugs. A full-day symposium on instrumentation has been planned.


