Norman Hackerman to Present 1964 Mattiello Memorial Lecture

The Federation of Societies for Paint Technology has announced that Norman Hackerman, Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs, The University of Texas, Austin, will present the 1964 Joseph J. Mattiello Memorial Lecture at the Federation's 42nd Annual Meeting to be held in the Conrad Hilton Hotel, Chicago, Ill., Nov. 5–7, 1964. Title of Dr. Hackerman's lecture will be "Surfaces, Sorption and Polymers in the Inhibition of Corrosion Reactions."

The Mattiello Memorial Lecture, instituted by the Federa-

tion in 1949, commemorates the name of Dr. Joseph J. Matiello (AOCS member who passed away in 1948) who, as a member of the Federation, did so much to expand the application of the sciences in the decorative and protective coatings field.

Of the fifteen previous outstanding scientists to receive one of the paint industry's highest honors—selection as a Mattiello Lecturer, the following have been AOCS members: T. F. Bradley, D. H. Wheeler, A. C. Zettlemoyer and Daniel Swern.

AOCS Appoints Quackenbush New Book Review Editor

A. R. Baldwin, JAOCS Editor, has announced the appointment of F. W. Quackenbush (1943) as Book Review Editor. He succeeds F. L. Jackson, who found it necessary to resign this position.

Dr. Quackenbush received his B.S. degree in Soil Chemistry from the University of Wisconsin; did graduate work at Iowa State College and the University of Wisconsin, receiving his Ph.D. from the latter in Biochemistry and Organic Chemistry. He was awarded a Rockefeller Foundation Fellowship to continue his study of research methods

in European laboratories, and spent 1938 at the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute, Heidelberg, Germany, and 1939 at Rijiks University, Utrecht, Holland.

He then returned to the University of Wisconsin, where he continued his research on fats and oils from 1940–1943. He was thereafter appointed to his present position as Head of the Department of Biochemistry, Purdue University, Lafayette, Ind. He also serves as an Indiana State Chemist.

His past and present fields of research include the chemistry and nutritive properties of lipids, molecular distillation of fats, fat deterioration, antioxidants and their functions, unsaturated fats and cholesterol metabolism, biosynthesis of unsaturated fatty acids and polyenes. He has reviewed many books for the Journal and authored numerous papers.
