Sonntag Gives "Insider's View"

The North Central Section was treated to an "Insider's View of Fat Chemical Research" at the November 17th meeting. The address was delivered by N. O. V. Sonntag, Research and Development Division of National Dairy in Glenview, Ill.

Dr. Sonntag brought out the function and importance of the research group in the company and then went into the opposited types of men needed to make up an effective "team," such as: man of "action," balanced by man of "thought"; strong man vs. supportive man; operations man vs. one skilled in handling people; idea man vs. practical realist; risk-taking man vs. cautious man; nice guy vs. tough guy; on only one lucky guy (probably lowest I.Q. in the group, who doesn't know enough not to try things); but all working together as a team with esprit de corps.
