Food Law Institute and FDA Discuss Regulations, Consumers' Needs

Emphasize Closer Relationship.

The Ninth Annual Education Conference sponsored by the Food Law Institute, Inc., and the Food and Drug Administration of the USDHEW was held Monday Dec. 6, 1965 at the Merriott Twin Bridges Motor Hotel, Washington, D.C.

The meeting was devoted to furthering the development of a closer relationship and better understanding between the regulated industries and FDA and to increasing the knowledge of both as to how best to comply with the needs and wishes of consumers.

Speakers from Government and Industry

Government and industry speakers reviewed the progress made since the Eighth Conference and revealed important projects which are in planning stage. A panel of representatives of FDA answered questions submitted in writing by the participants.

The meeting was called to order by J. L. Harvey, Dep. Commissioner, FDA. Among the speakers were: E. F. Ricketts, Associate Director, Public Administration Service; M. W. Alldredge, Vice Chairman, Great Atlantic and Pacific Tea Co.; T. R. Gamble, President, Pet Milk Company; J. T. Kelly, Legislative Council, Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association; R. W. Ballard, Vice President, Winthrop Laboratories; A. T. Buatti, Chairman, Pharmaceutical College of Pharmacy, St. John's University; W. C. Warren, Dean of Law School, Columbia University; H. F. O'Keefe, J. L. Trawick, W. B. Rankin and F. O. Kelsey, all of FDA. The dinner address "The Consumer's Interest" was given by Esther Peterson, Special Assistant to the President for Consumer Affairs.
