
Names in the News

Los Molinos, S. A., Adds Extraction Plant Operation

Ciudad Obregon, Sonora, Mexico, is a surprisingly modern and progressive municipality on the west coast of Mexico, in close proximity to Guadalajara, Mexico City and Acapulco. This area is becoming the center for large scale oil seed processing, in a program reminiscent of similar expansion in Lubbock, Texas, 15 years ago. The area is fully irrigated, and cotton and other oil

seed production is growing by leaps and bounds. Cotton production of 200,000 bales in 1965 should exceed 300,000 bales in 1966. Soybeans available for crushing should exceed 2,000,000 bushels this year, compared to 1,500,000 bushels last year. In addition there will be 40,000 metric tons of safflower seed and 15,000 metric tons of sesame seed available for crushing.

In anticipation of this increasing oil seed supply, Los Molinos, S. A., has just put into operation an integrated cottonseed plant with miscella refining and with facilities to process virtually every type of oil seed. Further, Los Molinos has recently acquired a second oil mill in Guadalajara which also has miscella refining and a finished products plant.

Within a mile radius of Los Molinos are two neighboring oil mills, Empresas Longoria, which installed a French Solvent Extraction Plant of 400 metric ton capacity two years ago; and Aceita, S. A., which is in the midst of an expansion project involving a French Stationary Basket Extractor installation.

Ciudad Obregon now becomes one of the five municipal areas on the North American Continent containing three or more oil mill solvent extraction plants. The others are Memphis, Tenn.; Lubbock, Texas; Decatur, Ill.; and Cedar Rapids, Iowa.
