AOCS Short Courses represent a continuing opportunity to review and enlarge upon special areas of Society interests, and to bring these to the attention of university and industrial research centers. Further, for newcomers to the field, the courses provide an opportunity to gain training and perspective in the diverse industries our membership represents.

The tradition is one of vision: It serves its membership well.

LeRoy Dugan, Jr., co-chairman of the East Lansing Short Course set for Aug. 29-Sept. 1, also led the 11th Short Course in 1960. For Mrs. Lois Crauer, who has worked with Dr. Dugan for this event, the chairman's role in the current Course is a "first" in this capacity for AOCS. The abstracts published in the July JAOCS indicate that the program created well covers the essentials of "Processing and Quality Control of Oils and Fats."

For those with vital interest in this expanding field, the course, as those which have gone before, presents an unique opportunity for professional growth.

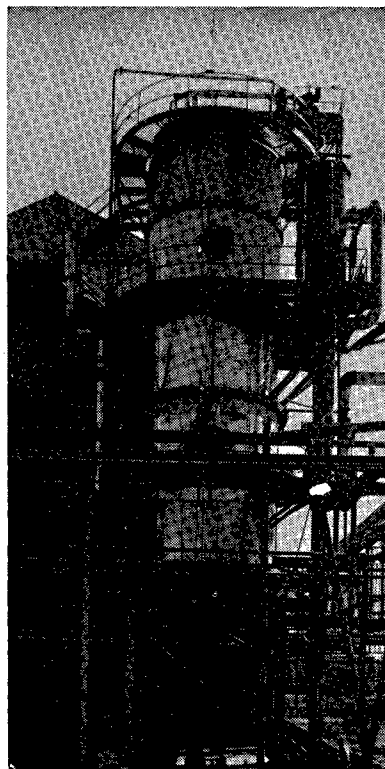
