

ISA Advance Program Available

This year's annual event will highlight "Instrumentation in the Service of Man" and will be held Sept. 11-14, 1967, in Chicago, Illinois. It is the only annual conference and exhibit in the United States devoted exclusively to instrumentation, systems, and automatic controls.

Some 20,000 scientists, engineers and educators active in all phases of instrumentation theory, design, application and manufacture are expected to attend the exhibits of 350 companies in the Chicago International Amphitheatre Exposition Hall—and the Conference and Symposia sessions at the Palmer House and Sheraton-Blackstone hotels. A special one-day Students Day Program of technical sessions will be conducted at the Sherman House on September 12.

The '67 technical program consists of 94 sessions of approximately 300 individual papers. These 94 technical sessions divide into 46 General Conference sessions (Sheraton-Blackstone Hotel), and 48 Symposia sessions (Palmer House Hotel) that comprise the 1st Data Handling and Computation Instrumentation Symposium, 4th Measurement Standards Instrumentation Symposium, and the 4th Physical and Mechanical Measurement Instrumentation Symposium.

ISA Conference Program Coordinator J. E. Jacobs, Professor of Electrical Engineering and Executive Director of the Bio-Medical Engineering Center, Northwestern University said that the figure, which is slightly higher than the '66 Conference figure, "still reflects the determination of session developers to select only the most meaningful papers for this year's program in an effort to stem the tide of the information flood."
