AOCS 62nd Annual Meeting to Convene at Shamrock Hilton Hotel Houston, Texas, May 2-6, 1971



What promises to be one of the most outstanding Spring Meetings of the American Oil Chemists' Society is rapidly taking shape in the Texas Gulf Coast region. The 62nd Annual Meeting dates are May 2-6, 1971, and following the successful precedent of past Houston meetings the location will be the Shamrock Hilton Hotel. In traditional Houston fashion, under the direction of T. I. Kennedy, an outstanding program of entertainment is being arranged that possesses equal appeal to both the men and their wives. Included in current plans are a

Sunday night Hawaiian Luau and Monday night Western Barbeque with appropriate buffets. Both of these functions will be held in the garden-like setting of the Shamrock poolside and terrace, and will feature outstanding groups of entertainment. Mrs. Kennedy heads the Planning Group providing additional entertainment for the women which will include luncheons, book reviews, tours of the Alley Theatre, Jones Hall for the Performing Arts, Baker Planetarium and Museum of Natural Science, Houston Museum of Fine Arts, plus a shopping tour in the fabulous Town and Country shopping district located in the Memorial Drive area of Houston. All of the above facilities are additions to Houston or have been greatly expanded since the 1965 Houston meeting.

Of additional interest to all will be the NASA complex following the Apollo 14 flight, the greatly expanded Texas Medical Center and the world famous Astrodome that now includes Astroworld.

The golf tournament on Tuesday, preceding the annual banquet, will be conducted under the guidance of the "Ben Hogan" of AOCS—Mr. W. A. Argue.

Other members of the Houston Committee whose contributions will insure our success are Duke Bryan, Registration and Reservations; R. H. Hammond, Plant Trips; Frank Passaladua, Publicity; and W. A. Jacob, Advisor.
