AOCs Past-President Klare S. Markley dies in Rio de Janeiro

AOCs Past-President Klare S. Markley, retired U.S. government vegetable oil chemist, died July 2 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, where he had resided for the past 13 years.

Born in Philadelphia, Markley received a B.Sc. in chemical engineering in 1924, M.Sc. in chemistry in 1925 from George Washington University, and Ph.D. in chemistry at Johns Hopkins University in 1929.

Markley's career was devoted largely to research leading to greater utilization of farm products and byproducts, especially vegetable oils. In 1927 he served in the USDA, first as assistant chemist and later as associate chemist, and in 1937 was designated as chief of the Regional Soybean Laboratory's oilseed section at Urbana, Illinois. In 1939 he became chief of the oilseed division at the Southern Regional Research Laboratory in New Orleans. In 1945 Markley served as a scientific consultant to the Joint Chiefs of Staff in Europe at the conclusion of World War II. He joined the staff of the Agency for International Development as a vegetable oil consultant in 1952 and served with the agency's U.S. Operations Mission in various countries, including Paraguay, Guatemala, Venezuela and Brazil. Following his retirement in 1960, he continued working as a vegetable oil consultant and author.

He contributed extensively to the technical literature concerned with the chemistry and physical properties of soybeans and fatty acids. His most recent work was a five volume treatise entitled, *Fatty Acids—Their Chemistry and Technology*. He also authored a two volume publication, *Soybeans and Soybean Products*, and jointly with W.H. Goss published *Soybean Chemistry and Technology*. He was the recipient of the Department of Agriculture's Superior Service Award in 1950 and the American Chemical Society's Southwest Regional Award in 1951.

Markley was president of the AOCs during 1944-45 and was a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, a member of the American Chemical Society, the American Soybean Association and the Foreign Service Association.

Leo Goldblatt retires

Leo A. Goldblatt, AOCs member since 1952, has retired from his post as chief of the Oilseed Crops Lab., USDA, New Orleans. Goldblatt began working in New Orleans in 1943 when the Naval Stores Research Division was transferred to the Southern Regional Research Center from Washington. Goldblatt moved to the Western Regional Research Center in 1959, and in 1963 returned to assume leadership of the Oilseed Crops Lab. In 1958 he was the corecipient of the USDA's Superior Service Award for the development of hydroperoxides from turpentine and of the Glycerine Research Award for work on tung oil monoglycerides. Goldblatt has authored or coauthored 166 publications and 28 patents.
