



## AOCS plans World Conference on Oilseed and Vegetable Oil Processing

The AOCS Governing Board has approved Executive Committee plans to hold The First World Conference on Oilseed and Vegetable Oil Processing. The conference is scheduled to be held in early 1976 in Amsterdam, The Netherlands.

Thomas Applewhite, Kraftco Research and Development Division, has been named conference chairman and will work with the national headquarters and with representatives of a variety of other organizations in planning the conference program, social events, and general logistics.

A large number of related organizations from around the world have been invited to take cosponsorship roles in the conference. While AOCS is the moving force behind the conference and assumes financial responsibility for it, these other organizations have been asked to participate actively on a steering committee and on a wide range of working

committees which are necessary for a major conference of this type. Announcements about the composition of the steering committee, program outline, cosponsorship, and other committee organization will be made at a later date.

Tentative plans call for a five day meeting to present the latest developments in the processing technology. All aspects of the industry will be covered in the program, including general economics and each step in the process of turning raw commodities into finished products.

Exhibits will be held in conjunction with the meeting. Special programs involving exhibits are being planned in an effort to make the exhibits a truly educational facet of the conference.

Preliminary plans also call for special charter or group travel from the U.S. to Amsterdam. Details will be released as plans are finalized.
