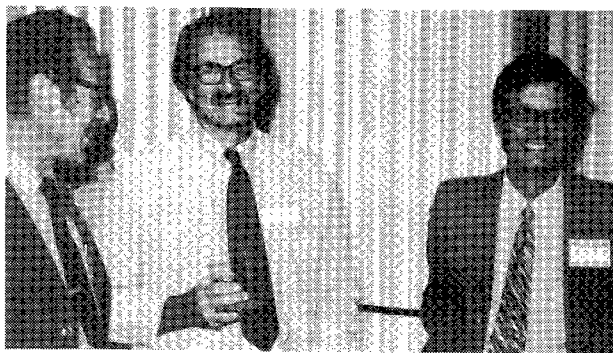
Technical session, tour highlight California Section meeting
