Gilmont to head CSSP

AOCS member Ernest R. Gilmont, who is currently president of The American Institute of Chemists, has been elected chairman of the Committee of Scientific Society Presidents for 1975.

The Committee of Scientific Society Presidents, organized in 1973, comprises the presidents of national scientific and professional societies, and represents all disciplines of science. The committee currently has 32 member societies with a total combined membership of more than 500,000.

The organization was formed, not only to provide a forum for the leaders of scientific societies to discuss important problems involving the American scientific community, but also as an interdisciplinary group to interact with all departments and agencies of the government.

Currently, technical director of A. Gross & Company, Newark, N.J., a division of Millmaster-Onyx Corp., Gilmont is well known for his efforts to improve the professional environment for chemists. He is a past president and Honor Scroll recipient of the New Jersey Institute of Chemists and has been selected as a Robert A. Welch Foundation lecturer for 1975. ■
