Membership votes for one meeting a year

In a vote of 859 to 372, AOCS members have voted to hold one national meeting a year. A schedule of one meeting a year will begin in 1977, since local committees have been organized and hotel commitments have been made through 1976.

Still to be decided is the time of year during which the single meeting should be held. A survey on this question accompanied the ballot, and a review of the meeting patterns of similar organizations is being conducted by the national office. Results of the survey and review will be used to help the Governing Board reach a decision on this question, perhaps as early as the 1975 Spring Meeting in Dallas, April 27-30.

The referendum of the AOCS membership was initiated in the spring of 1974 when an ad hoc committee, chaired by Robert Reiners, recommended to the Governing Board that the Society hold only one national meeting a year. Subsequently, a special business meeting at the 48th Fall Meeting in Philadelphia approved a by-laws change. Because of the broad interest expressed in the recommendation, the Governing Board conducted a referendum of the entire membership in late 1974 and agreed to be bound by the results of the vote.
