Bailey Award Dinner

The 16th Presentation Dinner of the Alton E. Bailey Award was held on March 17, 1976, at the Mug Pub Restaurant in Itasca, IL. The award was given by the North Central Section to Raymond Reiser, Distinguished Professor of the Department of Biochemistry and Biophysics at Texas A&M University, in recognition of his contributions to the understanding of fatty acid and cholesterol metabolism, his illustrious career as an educator, and his outstanding contributions to the American Oil Chemists' Society (see April 1976 JAOCS). Reiser was introduced by Henry Rakoff of Northern Regional Research Center. Last year's medalist, W.M. Cochran of Swift & Co., was present at the meeting.

Following the presentation of the Bailey Award by R.G. Krishnamurthy, North Central Section president, Reiser delivered his medal address entitled "The Interdependent Effects of Dietary Saturated and Polyunsaturated Fats, Cholesterol, and Phytosterols on Cholesterol Metabolism." He described his recent research in which eight casein-sucrose-cellulose semisynthetic diets were fed to 220-225 g male and female BHE rats. These diets contained either (1) 15% sterol-free lard; (2) 15% sterol-free safflower oil; (3 and 4) diets 1 and 2 with 0.5% cholesterol; (5 and 6) diets 3 and 4 with 0.25% mixed soy sterols; and (7 and 8) diets 3 and 4 with 0.5% soy sterols.

It was found that, after 10-12 weeks on these diets, the dietary fat alone has no effect on serum cholesterol but does increase serum triglycerides above the fat-free diet level, the lard more than the safflower oil. In addition, neither fat has any effect on liver cholesterol, but the cholesterol-free lard does result in higher liver triglycerides than sterol-free safflower oil.

Addition of cholesterol to the sterol-free lard increases serum cholesterol in the female from ca. 90 mg/100 ml to ca. 500 mg/100 ml. Its addition to the sterol-free safflower oil increases serum cholesterol to ca. 400 mg/100 ml. In the male, the two fats with cholesterol increase serum cholesterol from ca. 90 mg/100 ml to 200 mg/100 ml and 150 mg/100 ml, respectively. Liver triglyceride is little affected by dietary cholesterol in the female but is increased fivefold in the male.

One-half percent plant sterols in the cholesterolcontaining diets counteracts the effect of cholesterol on serum cholesterol. The plant sterols, on the other hand, increase serum triglycerides pronouncedly, especially in the males, but decrease liver triglycerides.

Diet cholesterol decreases hepatic 3-hydroxy-3-methylglutaryl Coenzyme-A reductase and increases cholesterol 7α -hydroxylase. Addition of plant sterols counteracts these cholesterol effects on the enzymes. Dietary cholesterol also causes a large increase in fecal bile acids, and plant sterols partially counteract this increase.

Reiser pointed out that there are many complex relationships between serum cholesterol levels and various components of the diet, including possible effects of different forms of dietary fiber. In view of these results, it seems unjustified for healthy individuals with normal blood cholesterol levels to avoid saturated fats and cholesterolcontaining foods.
