Tribute to C.P. Long

Dear Sir:

I would like to claim the privilege of a few honored comments on the death of C.P. Long. He was my first "boss" at P&G in 1931, except that "father" would have been a better title. In the depths of the depression when they didn't need me, he calmed and reasoned with an impatient youth when he really should have fired me. Later, as chairman of the Nominating Committee it was my privilege to persuade him to stand for a contested election resulting in his assumption as President in 1948. The more he resisted honors, the more were accorded him. The mere fact that he did not retire until age 75 is testimony to the value P&G regarded his services.

But this is a testimony to a man, not just to one of the most outstanding oil chemists of this century. I doubt if he ever made a single enemy in his life. I am certain that he probably helped more young men in advancing their careers than any other AOCS member in this century. I don't use the word lightly when I say he was "lovable." I have no idea as to what his religious beliefs might be, but I do know that his whole life was a witness to Christianity greater than

any man I ever knew. The printed page said that he died, but I don't believe everything I read. To me, "CP" will never die. I am a much better man just from knowing him, and working with him for almost 50 years.
