Obituaries

J.G. Bowling

Joe Green Bowling, a member of the American Oil Chemists' Society since 1953 and an AOCS Official Referee Chemist, died on June 25, 1978. He was 49.

Mr. Bowling was manager of the Woodson Tenent Labs in Goldston, NC. He previously had worked for the firm in Des Moines, IA, and transferred to the Goldston lab approximately four years ago. Mr. Bowling is survived by his widow and two grown children.

Clare Kalustian

Clare Kalustian, wife of AOCS member Peter Kalustian, died in her sleep on July 14, 1978. She was 65. Mrs. Kalustian had served as chairperson for spouses' programs at AOCS national meetings in Atlantic City and in New York (1977).

Mrs. Kalustian was secretary-treasurer for Peter Kalustian Associates Inc., an international consulting firm. She attended most national AOCS meetings and many meetings of the Northeast Section. Mrs. Kalustian had agreed to arrange a spouses' program for the 1980 meeting in New York.

Besides her husband, Mrs. Kalustian is survived by a son, a daughter, two grandchildren, two brothers, and a sister. \bullet

Eugene Nesom

Eugene Nesom, a member of the American Oil Chemists' Society since 1948, died on June 22, 1978, following a lengthy illness. Mr. Nesom was formerly chief chemist of Swift & Co. Corporate Quality Assurance. He was a graduate of Macalester College in St. Paul, MN.

Dalton E, Gandy

Dalton E. Gandy, president of the International Sunflower Association, died in a plane crash on July 12 about 50 miles south of Minneapolis, MN. He was 60. The other five persons aboard the private two-engine craft also died.

Mr. Gandy was a member of the program/steering committee for the World Conference on Vegetable Food Proteins to be held this fall and had been a speaker at the AOCS meeting this past May in St. Louis.

Mr. Gandy had become active in the sunflower organization for some time. He had retired from the National Cottonseed Products Association, for which he had been an agronomist, and had become affiliated with Rauenhorst, Bellows & Associates, the nation's largest producer of sunflower seed, about a year ago. The other five persons aboard also were affiliated with the firm, which leased the aircraft. All six were en route to a sales meeting in Indiana when the crash occurred. Initial reports indicated the plane, which crashed during a storm, had been hit by lightning and was aflame before it crashed.

A graduate of Louisiana State University, Mr. Gandy had worked with the NCPA from 1947 through the end of June 1977. He had done extensive work on sunflower while with NCPA. He was honored by the Memphis Ag Club as its 1976 Ag Man of the Year, and had helped make arrangements for the biennial international sunflower conference held in Minneapolis during July.
