
Technical Program for the AOCS 70th Annual Meeting



April 29-May 3, 1979 Fairmont Hotel San Francisco, California

Dear Friends and Colleagues:

The 70th Annual Meeting of AOCS and second Joint AOCS/JOCS Assemblage will take place early in 1979 at Beautiful San Francisco. This meeting is scheduled to begin April 29 and continue through May 3 for Oil and Lipid oriented scientists and processors from all over the world.

The San Francisco local organizing committee is well on the way to completing an outstanding and well balanced program — both technical and social.

For the first time, to the writer's knowledge, the business of the Society will be conducted during two plenary breakfasts. At 8 a.. Monday, April 30, we expect to see everyone, including the ladies, at breakfast in the Ballroom. After the plenary address, the ladies will be excused to participate in a tour of San Francisco which will familiarize them with some of the interesting places unique to this city. After the plenary speaker, we will have the first of two business meetings of the Society. We have also planned for a presentation from the New York AOCS Organizing Committee regarding the AOCS/IFS meeting scheduled for New York in 1980. Our technical sessions will start at 11 a.m. Monday, April 30.

On Wednesday, May 2, at 8 a.m., we will have the second plenary breakfast during which Society awards will be made, the Lipid Chemistry Lecture will be presented, and the new officers will be installed.

Dr. Jehiro Hara, chairman of the Executive Committee for the Japan Oil Chemists' Society 1979 AOCS/JOCS Joint Meeting, has arranged for forty-seven speakers, all of whom are prestigious scientists from universities, and medical research hospitals or industry, who will share with us during this meeting information emanating from their research. In addition, seven symposia will be cochaired by scientists from Japan.

To accommodate the many papers being presented, Technical Program Chairman Dave McClung and Cochairman Penny Wells have scheduled six simultaneous sessions during this four-day technical program.

Sandy Lyon, spouses' Entertainment Chairman, has interesting tours and happenings scheduled each day, Monday, April 30 through Thursday, May 3, with time allotted to visit Fisherman's Wharf and many of the unique shops and studios in the Bay Area.

If you come early or stay after the meeting, San Francisco and environs is a treasure trove of things to see and do. If seeing is your thing, you can visit Alcatraz Island, Barbary Coast, Chinatown, Cliff House, Fisherman's Wharf, Wine Museum, San Francisco Maritime Museum, Palace of Fine Arts, Old U.S. Mint, Golden Gate Park, Japan Center, Nob Hill, or North Beach.

The hotel committee, under the guidance of Francis McKenna, has arranged for sleeping rooms at the Fairmont Hotel, the Mark Hopkins, and the Holiday Inn. All technical sessions and committee meetings will be at the Fairmont.

Stan Loft is in charge of the entertainment and assures us of an outstanding and enjoyable social experience in this friendly city. Tennis will be available at the San Francisco Tennis Club for those desiring to play. There will be a golf tournament.



A visit to Hawaii can be the perfect topping to AOCS' 70th Annual meeting in San Francisco this year, and AOCS has developed a travel plan that offers participants a chance to make such a trip at sizable savings.

The plan includes air transportation to San Francisco for the AOCS meeting, then a flight to Honolulu on May 3, seven days with superior accommodations, and then a return flight back home on May 10. If you wish, you can add three days to the Hawaiian visit with an optional weekend stay on the island of Maui. Accommodation costs are based on double occupancy.

Costs will vary, depending on where you live. The seven-days-in-Hawaii package from Chicago, for example, would cost \$645; from New York, \$730; Memphis, \$695; Dallas, \$540; and San Francisco, \$450. The ten-days-in-Hawaii package costs would range from \$700 from Dallas to about \$880 from New York. Single occupancy supplement for the seven-day tour would cost about \$120 more and for ten days, about \$190 more.

Normal round trip coach airfare from Chicago to Hawaii is \$524 for a seven-day trip, \$574 for ten days. Round-trip coach airfare from Chicago to San Francisco is \$356, which means the additional airfare plus seven days accommodations will cost about \$290. Savings are similar from the other cities mentioned.

AOAC to hold 1979 spring training workshop and exposition in San Francisco

The Association of Official Analytical Chemists (AOAC) will hold its fourth annual regional Spring Training Workshop and Exposition May 6-9, 1979 at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel, San Francisco, CA, the week after the JOCS-AOCS meeting in San Francisco.

The spring workshop provides state-of-the-art presentations in selected analytical subject areas. Attendees are encouraged to participate in discussions and to present their own problems in the subject areas under discussion.

The workshop will feature technical state-of-the-art sessions on analysis of agricultural products for pesticides and heavy metals; bacteriological analysis of foods, and forensic sciences.

Sessions on advances in High Pressure Liquid Chromatography and Gas Liquid Chromatography are also planned, with emphasis on application to food and drug analysis. A session on the isolation and identification of filth elements in food may be held as a workshop.
