New York Hilton at Rockefeller Center April 27-May 1, 1980

The 71st annual meeting of the American Oil Chemists' Society will be held April 27-May 1, 1980, in New York City as a joint meeting with the International Society for Fat Research.

The ISF/AOCS World Congress will be the second combined meeting for the two international organizations, the first having been held in 1970 in Chicago. More than 1,000 persons are expected to attend, general chairman Peter Kalustian has estimated. Kalustian is president of the ISF through the 1980 meeting.

Dr. Stephen S. Chang, program chairman and honorary ISF president through 1980, has invited well-known specialists in North America and Europe to begin organizing symposia on all topics of interest to persons in the fats and oils and lipids field.

As is customary at ISF meetings, the technical program will incorporate several plenary lectures. Technical sessions will begin about 10 a.m. each morning, after plenary sessions have concluded.

A lively, diverse spouses' program is being planned for persons accompanying technical program registrants. Social events for all registrants will include an opening mixer, an evening banquet, and other events.



Processing, methodology short courses offered for 1980

AOCS will present two short courses in 1980 the week before the ISF/AOCS World Congress is held in New York City.

"Processing and Quality Control of Fats and Oils" will be held April 21-23; "Applications of Analytical Methodology" will be held April 23-25. Both will be at The Concord Hotel at Kiamesha Lake, approximately two hours' drive from New York City.

Frank Naughton, manager of the plastics and specialty chemicals applications laboratory for NL Industries' Industrial Chemicals Division, is local chairman for the courses. Program chairman for the processing course will be T.L. Mounts of the Northern Regional Research Center. He served as chairman for a similar short course in 1977 at Michigan State University. Program chairmen for the methodology short course will be David Berner, food scientist in corporate research for Nabisco's food science department, and David Min, principal scientist at Best Foods Research Center.
