The ISF/AOCS World
Congress from April 27May 1, 1980, will be held in
one of the world's major
meeting centers — New York City.
Approximately 17 million people
visit New York each year, many of
them to attend one of the 800-plus
meetings and conventions held each
year.

While the main activity of the World Congress will be the 300 to 400 technical papers expected to be presented, registrants may use their evenings to sample a few of New York's 28,000 restaurants, 35 Broadway theaters, or 100 other night spots featuring entertainment.
